GALLI-CURCI RECITAL

Capacity Crowd Again Greets Great Coloratura at the Academy The amazing popularity of Amelita Galli-Curci again was demonstrated

last evening at the Academy of Music, when a crowd that filled the building to the doors and overflowed on the stage to the extent of 400 or 500 persons, greeted the great Italian colora-tura on the occasion of her first recital

here this season,
Mme, Galli-Curci's program presented some novelties, at least as far as Philadelphia audiences are concerned, as well as some of the num-bers in which she is supreme in the field of coloratura work. Among the former were an old Italian aria by Lotti, coupled with a modern Italian one by Donaudy, the "Mad Scene" from Thomas' "Hamlet," a florid but generally ineffective number, except in

She also showed a tendency to depart from pitch, noticeably in the number with the most inflexible of all instruments, the flute.
