

AUTOISTS DELAYED AT WALNUT BRIDGE

Repair Work to Be Kept Up for Another Month at Least, Officials Say

ANNOYANCE TO TRAFFIC

The delay experienced by motorists and trolley riders who use the Walnut Street Bridge will continue for another month. The work of repairing the bridge, which is being done by the city and the P. R. T., has been a source of annoyance for two weeks to motorists of West Philadelphia who are expected to find it in a state of repair because of the use of the east-bound track and both east-bound and west-bound tracks. Complaints about delay in attention to the fact that the volume of trolley traffic over this bridge has lately been increased by the closing of South Street Bridge and the diversion of traffic to Walnut street. Now at the point of repair, the east-bound trolleys are directed to the east-bound tracks, and then beyond the point of repair the trolley swings back to the west-bound track again. The east-bound and west-bound trolleys, for some distance along the northern side of the bridge, which prevents the use of the bridge for west-bound automobile traffic.

The use of one track for trolley traffic in different directions results in delay, as while the cars are passing over repair work west, the east-bound trolleys are held up, and vice versa. A watchman is detailed at the bridge and by means of lanterns at night and flags during daytime signals cars of way to approaching trolleys. Prof. R. H. Fernald, head of the Mechanical Engineering Department of the University of Pennsylvania, declares that the conditions are intolerable, and suggests that work be expedited by night shifts. "It would involve a little extra expense, it is true, but the progress of the work at night is not held up by any engineering difficulties," declares Professor Fernald, "and to relieve the congestion almost any step is justified." At the offices of the P. R. T., it was stated that they would put on night shifts to complete the work if the city would do so, but the city was entirely up to the city. The quicker the repairs are accomplished the more satisfactory it is to the P. R. T. for the prevailing conditions are a source of additional expense to them, and increased traffic in rush hours, especially, was declared. Hugh Dunlop, chief of the Highway Bureau, declared that the work should be done at night, but the drilling and setting of the plates, which support the roadbed over the bridge are being replaced as quickly as possible, but that the nature of the work is such that it would probably take another month to complete it.
