

SEVEN SCHOOLBOYS REVOLT IN CLASS

Police Called to Randall Arrest
Boys Disorderly in
Class Room
TROUBLE BEYOND TEACHERS

Seven boys raised such a disorder in the Randall School, Baltimore street above Ninth, yesterday, that instructors were compelled to call police to arrest them and ending a disturbance featured by flying school books, damaged chairs and desks and broken windows.

Not one was more than fifteen years old. The youngest was ten. Their arrival for the morning session of school was somewhat delayed, but when teachers sought an explanation for their tardiness, they got such answers.

Indignant by school authorities' explanations, they started to make the boys boisterous and unruly. They began firing things about the room and generally making a racket which could be heard all over the building. Other instructors called in to assist in ending the disorder could do nothing.

Finally, police from the Second and Christian streets station were called in to arrest them.

They were taken to the House of Detention and will be given a hearing there.

The boys under arrest are: Marion Guillo, fourteen years, Hutcheson street, below Catharine; His brother, Angelo, fifteen years, Broad; Joe Marie, twelve years, Baltimore street above Ninth; John Brasso, Delaware avenue below South; Joseph Choleba, thirteen years, Ninth street below South; Augustina Tespa, ten years, Darius street below Catharine; Henry Orzini, ten years, Ninth street below South.

MANUFACTURES INCREASE
Show 7.2 Per Cent Gain Here Over 1914, Report Says

The Department of Commerce, through the Bureau of Economic Warfare, reports the general results of the 1920 census of manufactures, covering the year 1919, for Philadelphia. The figures are preliminary and subject to interchange and correction as may be found necessary from a further examination of the reports.

Manufacturing establishments numbered 1002, an increase of 7.2 per cent over 1914, while the number of persons engaged in manufactures increased 17 per cent to 828,965. For 1919 the amount of capital is shown to have been \$1,249,765,000, against \$772,000,000 in 1914, an increase of 100.9 per cent. Value of products increased 154.3 per cent to \$1,000,727,000.
