This ruling was made by the com-missioner to stop abuses which were charged last year when messengers came here from Philadelphia and other cities and carried away numerous sets of tags while the mail-order business of tags was jammed up by the big rush which started around the holidays. The commissioner in a statement

"An office delivery is maintained at the automobile division in Harrisburg. the automobile division in Harrisburg, and persons are accommodated in the order in which they arrive at the window. To avoid congestion and delay of delivery at the office, not more than five registrations will be issued to any

person at one time.
"A person presenting more than five applications will be given five regis-trations, after which this person will be considered a new arrival at the of-fice and will be required to take his place at the rear of the line of appli-The exact amount of the fee required must be presented with the ap-plication in the form of a certified check, postoffice money order or cur-

The department has received approximately 25,000 applications for 1922 registrations. Shipment of these will be made commencing this week. Mr. Sadler urges motorists to apply early. so they will have their tags for use
