

**LOYD GEORGE HAS PLAN FOR EGYPT**

Finishing Touches Being Put on Arrangement for Independence of Nile Country

**DOMINIONS HAVE VOICE**

Copyright, 1921 London, Nov. 4.—Lloyd George is now busy putting the finishing touches to the plan for the proposed settlement of the Egyptian question, which is curiously like the problem of Ireland. The proposed settlement provides for the independence of Egypt, the British re-

servicing the right to keep troops at the Suez canal and at strategic points to guard foreigners. The British dominions insist upon having a voice in the settlement of Egypt, particularly India and New Zealand. The dominions have two claims. The campaign which freed Egypt from Turkey, making the present settlement possible, was fought by Indian and Anzac troops, and also they have a strong practical interest, as the canal is the principal link in their line of communication with their mother country. The scheme, after consideration and approval by the Cabinet, must be approved by the dominions, after which it will be put up to Adyl Pasha, the chief of the Egyptian delegation at London.

Maguire Tells Teachers' Institute Day of God Is Passed Doylestown, Pa., Nov. 4.—Addressing 500 teachers attending the sixtieth annual session of the Bucks County Teachers' Institute yesterday in the courthouse, Miss Margaret T. Maguire, principal of the George McCall School, Philadelphia, said corporal punishment in the schools of America today was outrageous, old-fashioned and unsatisfactory. She said in part: "Spiritual discipline is the only thing that can accomplish any good today. Get away from the old-fashioned, pleasure technique of the schoolroom and show the pupils how to look at things in a spiritual light. Get away from the intellectual stuff and teach the boys and girls proper American citizenship. Treat your pupils like human beings and you will get results." Dr. Preston Bradley last night delivered an address on "The United States of Tomorrow." The institute will close tonight.
