

**INCOME-TAX RELIEF  
MAILED BY CLERGY**

**Senate Plan to Exempt Rectory  
Rent Called Fair by Min-  
isters Here**

**SALARIES SMALL ANYWAY**

Clergymen who live in rectories or parsonages furnished rent free by their congregations will have a smaller income tax to pay if a Senate amendment to the Tax Revision Bill is enacted into law.

The amendment, just adopted, provides that ministers who are provided with parsonages rent free need no longer account for the rental value of the parsonage when estimating their taxable income.

Ministers in this city declared the proposed change welcome. If ready relief, they pointed out that ministerial incomes are none too large as they are and that the relief is equitable.

The Rev. Dr. Linn Bowman, pastor of the Spring Garden Church, said that since the foundation of Methodism ministerial salaries had been listed independent of house rent.

In calculating the pastor's income, he said, so much salary and so much house rent were listed, when in reality the house rent was part of the salary.

**Items Are Separated**

"Eight years ago," Dr. Bowman continued, "the General Conference decided that we must add our parsonage rental value to our salaries. When the income tax was adopted it based taxation on the entire income subject, of course, to certain exemptions.

"The amendment is equitable for the reason that no man could properly estimate his house rental on the sliding scale of values today. For example, a parsonage rental value in Reading would be estimated at \$500, and in Philadelphia it might be estimated at \$1200, although the congregations in the two cities would be in the same parity in their ability to pay salaries.

"As another example, a minister in Potstown receiving a \$4000 salary could estimate the parsonage rental value at \$800, making his total income \$4800, while a minister in Philadelphia receiving a salary of \$4000 probably would have to add \$1200 to his parsonage rental value, making a total income of \$5200.

**Thinks Amendment Is Fair**

"I believe the amendment is a fair adjustment,"

The Rev. Carter Heins Jones, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church, said that while he does not live in a parsonage himself, he feels that the provision was unfair to ministers, who are not well paid for their services.
