Dauphin County has apparently given Justice William I. Schaffer a majority of 5000 for Supreme Court and precincts to hear from may increase that lead. Judges William M. Hargess, Frank B. Wickersham and John E. Fox have been elected for the full term after having been appointed by the Governor.

Incomplete returns show the Democratic candidates running close or leading in Northumberland County, where Justice C. McConnell, former Senator and State Probation Director, is the leader.
