Bethlehem, Pa., Nov. 19.—Lafayette's powerful eleven led Lehigh 7 to 0 at the end of the first period in the game here today. Elliott scored a touchdown on straight football soon after the opening of the first period. Brennan kicked goal.

Long before game time the stands began to fill. First to arrive was the solid line-up of Boettler's "Sand Hogs." They bustled in the gates on mause as soon as the barriers were unbolted. It is an organization, formed by Lehigh's director of physical education, composed of the street gamins. A section of the stands is reserved for them at each game. They had no college cheer leader, get in for cheering and are pledged to clean sportsmanlike.

Alumni of both colleges came on special trains and autos from all directions. It looked like a motor parade as machines crawled to the arena over South Mountain, from Easton and Allentown, past the quaint churches and Colonial buildings in the streets of this historic town, and dumped their noisy cargoes before the portals of Taylor Stadium.

Both sides had the south side of the field. Its colors, Maroon and White, were plastered all over the stands there in pennants and chrysanthemums. Its famous band, in maroon sweaters and white flannels, made things turbulent, with here a chord and there a discord.

Lehigh's student body marched to the field in column of four, half in line for the game behind its band, dressed in brown and white. The riot was on. Antiphonal cheering made the welkin ring. Everything was cheered, especially the young ladies' parade from two girls' schools of Bethlehem which attended in a body.

First Period

Captain Geiges, of Swarthmore, won the toss and elected to receive Haverford's kickoff at the south end of the field. Brown kicked off to Brown on Swarthmore's 10-yard line. Both received the ball 20 yards. Earp receiving around Haverford's right end for 22 yards. Yarnall was dumped without gain. Earp shot through center for 5 yards.

A forward pass, Asplundh to Ogden, earned 22 yards. Yarnall had 2 yards on fake kick play. Swarthmore was penalized 15 yards for holding. Asplundh made up 12 yards holding. Haverford's left end, Earp failed to gain 4 yards. Earp fumbled. Yarnall gained 22 yards. Earp fumbled again. Earp shot through center for 5 yards.

First Period

Acting Captain Schwab and Captain McCarthy met in the center of the field, Lafayette winning the toss. Stover kicked off for Lehigh. Gazella receiving the ball and running it back to the 32-yard line. The first play was smeared. Lafayette was penalized 15 yards for holding.

Gazella made a yard on a reverse play. On the fourth down, Brennan kicked to Hardy, who fumbled. The ball was recovered by Hardy on Lehigh's 32-yard line. Time was taken out for Hardy, who was given a great cheer when he said in the game. After falling to the ground, the line was set. Earp, a forward pass to Hardy, which was knocked down by Lafayette. Stover punted high out of bounds on Lafayette's 45-yard line. Read threw Gazella for an 8-yard loss on an attempted end run on the next play. Lehigh was penalized 15 yards for roughness.

On the third down, Earp and Lafayette was penalized 15 yards for roughness midfield. On a reverse play, Earp took the ball to Lehigh's 20-yard line. Elliott made 5 at center. Earp was hurt, but remained in the game. Elliott went through center for 5 yards. Another line back by Elliott and Lafayette a first down on Lehigh's 5-yard line.

Lingle, Lehigh, replaced Bessemer. Williams kicked off to Lingle, who ran 18 yards before he was thrown. Hardly kicked to Brennan who was shoved out of bounds on Lafayette's 5-yard line. Earp on a double pass made 6 yards. Elliott went through center but, Earp was penalized 15 yards for holding. Lafayette's ball on her own 8-yard line.

Brennan took the ball from Lafayette on one. Two plays with Lingle carrying the ball gained only one yard. Hardly to Lingle who was thrown out of bounds after gaining 3 yards. Hardly punted to Brennan who was downed. The ball was stopped by three Lehigh men. Brennan lunged up savagely with his feet but failed to do any damage, the ball was brought back and Lafayette was penalized 15 yards. Lingle almost broke away on the play. Earp, a forward pass on the 26-yard line, Lehigh fans yelled for a touchdown. A pass, Hardly to Greer, gained but two yards.
