

# PHILA. PRIEST MADE AUXILIARY BISHOP

## The Rev. Michael J. Crane Raised at Secret Consistory Called by Pope

Rome, Nov. 21.—The Pope held this morning a secret consistory in the presence of all the Cardinals living in Rome, in which he appointed the following Bishops:

The Right Rev. Thomas E. Molloy, titular Bishop of Loria and administrator of the diocese of Brooklyn, N. Y.; the Right Rev. Alexander J. McArthur, titular Bishop of Marcepolis, transferred to the vacant See of La Crosse, Wis.; the Right Rev. Joseph H. Conroy, titular Bishop of Ardele and administrator of the diocese of Ogdensburg, transferred to the vacant See of Ogdensburg, N. Y.

The Pope also officially announced the following appointments which were made by brief since the last Consistory: The Most Rev. Michael Curley, former Bishop of St. Augustine, Fla., appointed Archbishop of Baltimore, Md.; the Right Rev. Joseph Schrembs, former Bishop of Toledo, appointed Bishop of Cleveland, O.; the Rt. Rev. Samuel A. Stritch, Chancellor of the Diocese of Nashville, appointed Bishop of Toledo, O.; the Rt. Rev. John J. Dunn, Chancellor of the Archdiocese of New York, appointed Auxiliary Bishop of New York; the Rt. Rev. Michael J. Crane, appointed Auxiliary Bishop of Philadelphia; the Rt. Rev. Edward F. Holban, Chancellor of the Archdiocese of Chicago, appointed Auxiliary Bishop of Chicago.

During the secret Consistory the Pontiff delivered an allocution, which has not yet been published.

Word giving official confirmation of appointment of Bishop Michael J. Crane as Auxiliary Bishop of Philadelphia was received from the Vatican at Rome today.

The vacancy which Bishop Crane's appointment filled was made at a time before the regular Consistory. He was appointed and at the regular Consistory the appointment was confirmed.

The actual vesting of authority in Bishop Crane, the giving of the various insignia of his office was done September 19, Cardinal Dougherty officiated at the ceremony in the Cathedral of St. Peter and Paul.

Conwell's thirty-ninth year as pastor of the church. A community service was held in the afternoon. ## City's Quota in \$15,000,000 Campaign Will Be Fixed

Many prominent Philadelphia Jews are attending the national conference being held in New York at which plans will be formulated for the development of Palestine. Philadelphia's quota, as well as that of other cities in the \$15,000,000 nation-wide drive, will be fixed at the sessions, which will continue today and tomorrow.

The Philadelphia delegation will present a program to the conference by which funds will be raised. The program concerns a plan whereby American Jews will be asked to give a part of their earnings to the Palestine project. The slogan that the Philadelphia representatives carried to the conference is "No Casual Charity Will Suffice for the Uplifting of Palestine."

The gathering is under the auspices of the Kerem Hayesod, the Palestine Foundation Fund, which is promoting the upbuilding of Palestine.

# CROWDS WATCH FIREMEN

## Blaze at 523 Ludlow Street, Near Sixth and Market

Fire which started from a defective fuse on the roof of 523 Ludlow street at 8:15 o'clock this morning did several hundred dollars damage to the roof and to the Quaker Electroplating Company, which occupies the fourth and top floor.

Large crowds collected in Fifth and Sixth streets to watch the firemen running up and down the fire-escape of the building. Business was temporarily suspended in the surrounding buildings and every window held spectators.

The fire was soon extinguished, but not until it had burned a large hole in the roof and damaged the floor below. The first floor is occupied by the Redoubt Box Manufacturing Company, the second floor by a tailoring establishment and the third floor by the Mendell carpenter shop. The building is immediately east of the rear entrance of the Wanamaker & Brown clothing company.
