Will Reduce Army

Premier of France, who told the Arms Conference the need of a large army.

France began to demobilize as rapidly as possible and the period of enforced military service was reduced from three to two years. The result, he said, was to reduce the three military classes to two.

Now, he continued, France proposed further restrictions, so that her army soon would be reduced to half its former strength. France, he added, had need to feel the assurance of the moral support of her recent allies in the war.

Mr. Briand called attention to an item of \$81.22 on Mr. Chandler's schedule of assets. It had been written in his own handwriting and then was crossed out.

Mr. Briand had before him a slip or two of notes on the big green table, but he did not refer to them, and in this respect followed his manner of speaking from the tribune of the Chamber of Deputies.

Mr. Briand radiated force and intellectual power, and today his every intonation and gesture indicated that he felt the seriousness of his subject and its great importance to France.

Mr. Briand's address was characterized by Mr. Balfour as a "perfectly candid" explanation of the anxieties and pre-occupations of France.

Mr. Briand then put the case up to America. "Suppose that by your side," he said, "there was a nation that for years had been in bloody conflict with you."

Mr. Briand then pointed out that France had been disarmed by Napoleon and added: "But she found her place on the battlefield. How could we forget that?"

After the armistice, M. Briand said, largely destroyed, the premier agreed, but he said that the problem of material France was not one that could not be solved.
