John J. Fisher is in Serious Condition in Hospital Following Arrest

SAY KICK KILLED WOMAN

John J. Fisher, of 4015 Locust street, is in a serious condition in the Hahnemann Hospital, following his arrest charged with having caused the death of his wife, Mrs. Anna Fisher, in the West Philadelphia Homeopathic Hospital Saturday night.

Fisher is thirty-two years old and his wife was forty. When Fisher was arrested and taken to City Hall, he was held to await the action of the coroner. He collapsed and was examined by Police Surgeon Egan. Symptoms of pneumonia were discovered and the man was at once taken to the hospital. He declared the kick to have been entirely accidental.
