

MILLBOURNE PUTS BAN ON P. R. T. PARK

Passes Ordinance Forbidding Erection of Amusement Place at 63d and Market

YERKES GETS OFFICIAL O. K.

The P. R. T. amusement park, proposed on a site at Sixty-third and Market streets, has been forbidden by an ordinance passed last night by the Millbourne Borough Council.

The Millbourne ordinance prohibits construction, operation or maintenance of such a park, and names all the usual devices and concessions. It states such a park will be deemed a public nuisance. If operation of any concession shall be a separate offense, the penalty for which shall be \$100 fine or five days in jail or thirty days in the Delaware County Prison.

The ordinance was passed by a vote of 6 to 1. The Councilman voting against it was Michael Weinstein.

The park was first proposed for 100 per cent. The ordinance was passed prohibiting it. Stonehurst was the site selected next, but that borough obtained an injunction.

A resolution approving the action of D. Martin Yerkes, the "Boing" expert, was also passed by the Council last night. Squire Yerkes and his associates have been conducting a strenuous campaign against speeding motorists. Weinstein and Franklin D. Edmonds voted against it after J. Robert Reber, president of the Council and borough assessor, had made an address favoring it.

Ten appeals have been taken from the decisions of Yerkes and six have been reversed by the courts of Delaware County. The Millbourne Council, in its resolution directed Isaac Johnson, Jr., the borough solicitor, to take up with the District Attorney the matter of appealing the case to the Superior Court, in an effort to uphold Yerkes. The purchase of signs to be marked "Speed Limit Fifteen Miles an Hour" also was authorized.

A total of 401 motorists have been summoned before Yerkes. Of these 225 were discharged with a warning, seventy-one paid fines and costs, and ninety-six were cited. These were 298 of these motorists going toward Philadelphia and 201 coming from Philadelphia.
