LARGE MARINE RE-ENLISTS

335-Pound Philadelphian Was Noted for Feats of Strength

The United States took on a naval handicap today when James D. Turzanski, gunnery sergeant of this city, the largest marine, re-enlisted. 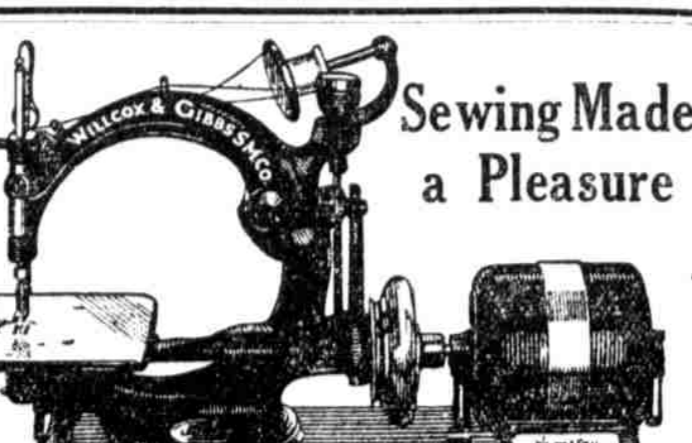

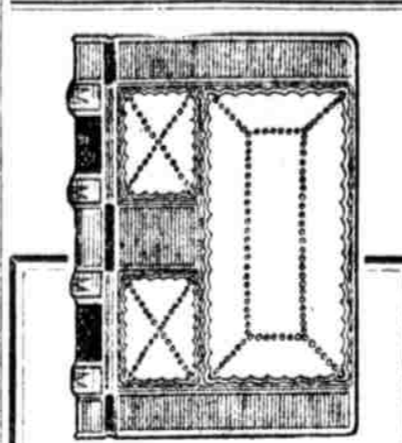

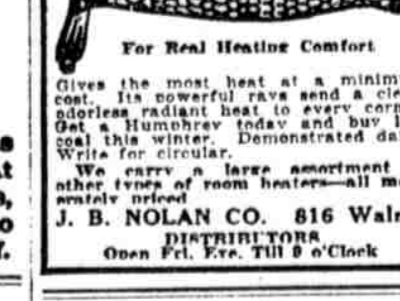
