

FRANCE REFUSES TO ADMIT MORSE TO VISIT IN FRANCE

Reported Orders Him Back to U. S. on First Available Vessel

SHIP MAGNATE ASKS DELAY BIG CAMPAIGN PLANNED

By the Associated Press. Paris, Dec. 3.—The French Ministry of the Interior today issued an order denying Charles W. Morse the right to land in France and requiring him to return to the United States on the first available steamer which would be the Paris, sailing Monday from Havre.

The report of Morse's visit to France in 1920, and the fact that he had been in the United States for some time, were the basis of the order. Morse is a well-known American shipper and a member of the American Shipowners' Association.

Mr. Morse declared that he had no objection to being placed in a French prison, but that he would not be taken to France for the purpose of being held there until the return of the steamer George Washington on January 7.
