

## "NOISELESS" PARK PLANNED BY P. R. T.

Mitten Says Music Would Be Chief Feature of Site Beyond 63d Street

### Gordon Wins Point

**One of the Irish delegates said:** "You can not quite dismiss us and our claims and our history in that way. We, too, are an ancient parent state, and we have through the centuries done our part in the development of every corner of the habitable civilized globe."

In discussing the financial phases of the agreement, he said: "In matters of finance there again the Parliament to be set up is supreme in its own house, and the other delegations have recognized that it is necessary to strike a balance between the two countries and in financial matters."

On such a balance, they shall pay us a due proportion, having regard for any set off or counter claim they may wish to put forward—a due proportion of our national debt and our expenditure on war."

The amount of this, he said, will be determined by arbitrators to be appointed to determine the debts of the country, and who, I hope, will include a distinguished Colonial Judge.

"In the opinion of all my colleagues the interests of Ireland itself and of the empire as a whole will be forwarded should it become possible in the future for the inhabitants of Northern Ireland to adhere to a general Parliament, while maintaining existing legislation reserved for the decision of the Northern Ireland Parliament alone, still require decision and obviously affect the interests of Ireland taken as a unit and as a whole."

"The representatives from Sinn Fein are prepared to recommend to the Dail Eireann that the newly constituted Irish free state, after the termination of its period of association with the British Empire, but shall enter into the British Empire for all purposes."

"The delegation, he said, will be in a position to give a full knowledge of the Japanese Government before definite action is taken."

**Judge Overrules Writs**

Full power of decision without hindering her by conditions.

It is also understood that an arrangement satisfactory to the Sinn Fein was reached regarding control of Irish ports by the navy.

A condition previously insisted upon that there must be free trade between England and Ireland is said to have been dropped by the Government and Ireland is given freedom regarding tariffs.

The delegates of the Dail Eireann, however, explained that it would be to Ireland's advantage to have free trade with the common market, and that it would mean the voluntary adoption of the same.

The agreement was signed on behalf of the Government by Prime Minister Lloyd George, Austen Chamberlain, Lord Birkenhead and Winston Spencer Churchill, and on behalf of the Sinn Fein by Arthur Griffith, Michael Collins and Robert C. Barton.

Desmond Fitzgerald and Lamon J. Duggan, members of the Sinn Fein peace delegation, left for Dublin today. It is thought they are carrying a draft of the agreement. All other Sinn Fein delegates remained here.

The agreement, after a session which lasted more than three hours, came as the sudden and unexpected distinction of the feelings expressed last night followed a day of conference during which it was at one time understood that the negotiations had definitely broken down, and that only questions of continuing the truce in Ireland remained to be considered.

**Belfast, Dec. 6.—(By A. P.)** News of the agreement between the British and Sinn Fein delegations in London was published in the late editions of the Belfast morning news-papers.

Official circles today showed a disposition to postpone comment on the news until the details of the agreement became known. Political leaders, however, are said to regard any compromise between the British and Sinn Fein delegations as defeat for Ulster. The views of the parties to the peace negotiations, they say, are so irreconcilable that it is difficult to imagine what will appeal to the Sinn Fein, who will be regarded as supporters to the British.
