

Train No. 151, from Phi.adelphia, was scheduled to meet and pass Train 154, a milk train, and Train 156, a commuters train, bound cityward. Nos. 151 and 154 were both late or they would have passed at Huntingdon Valley siding. The conductor of No. 134, the milk train, waited at Bryn Athyn because he knew he could not go further in safety with No. 151 approaching. The milk train waited far enough behind the siding switch to be "in the clear," so No. 151 could pass the switch and back in. This was done and the milk train proceeded. The mistake came when No. 151 did not continue to wait, as ordered, for No. 156, but left the siding, only to meet No. 156 head-on in the rock cut a mile away




