

ALUMNI AT PENN PLAN FUND DRIVE

\$10,000,000 Is Sought for Former Students to Add to Present Endowments

TRUSTEES BACK CAMPAIGN

Preliminary plans to add \$10,000,000 to the endowment funds of the University of Pennsylvania are being made by the two committees representing the Board of Trustees and General Alumni Society.

At the last meeting of the Board of Trustees it was declared no time should be lost in starting the work. William Redding, of New York City, is chairman of the Trustees' Endowment Committee.

The necessity for thorough preliminary preparation is treated editorially in the current issue of the Pennsylvania Gazette, the graduate weekly magazine.

"As we see it, the prime requisite is an organization of the alumni so that the individual responsibility in every plan is decided upon to add \$10,000,000 to the endowment funds.

The word "program" has an uncertainty sound since the war, but a preliminary campaign of information will be the most effective aid the two committees can have to insure the success of their work.

"The next step should be the organization of an endowment committee, with national representation. It will be remembered that after Dr. Penniman urged upon the alumni the early starting of an endowment drive in his address to the New York Club in October, 1920, this energetic group responded immediately with a resolution urging the General Alumni Society to organize such a board.

Some of our alumni who have been inclined to excuse our failure to get have done so with the statement that the time is not propitious for launching a campaign of this sort. That, however, is no reason for not starting the preliminary work at this time.

Every week's delay merely adds to the difficulty in raising the amount required.

MARINES REFUSE QUARTERS

Warburton Says Detachment Turned Down Better "Billets"

The city has done everything in its power to provide sanitary quarters for the marines guarding mills, who are now billeted under insanitary conditions in a building at 1626 Arch street, according to Police Commissioner Warburton, but Captain McClure, commander of the marine detachment, has refused to accept the offers made.

Harry M. Baker, commander of the Oscar H. Gruber Post of the American Legion, inspected 1626 Arch street, where ninety-six marines are living, and reported conditions were deplorable from a sanitary standpoint. Physicians of the Department of Health sustain this opinion.

Major Warburton said today he had offered comfortable dormitories in the Twelfth and Pine streets station, and had even obtained from his father-in-law, John Wanamaker, the third and fourth floors of the Market Street Laundry, on Filbert street, with light and heat free. Captain McClure, he said, declined all the offers. The marines rent the building at 1626 Arch street. Captain McClure is now considering a building of twenty-two rooms, at Nineteenth and Vine streets, offered by the city.

According to Mrs. Brock, she left the suitcase in the machine because of its weight and also because she intended to return to the car almost immediately. Five minutes later the bag was missing. Mrs. Brock, formerly Miss Pauline Riddle, of this city, is registered at the Ritz-Carlton Hotel.
