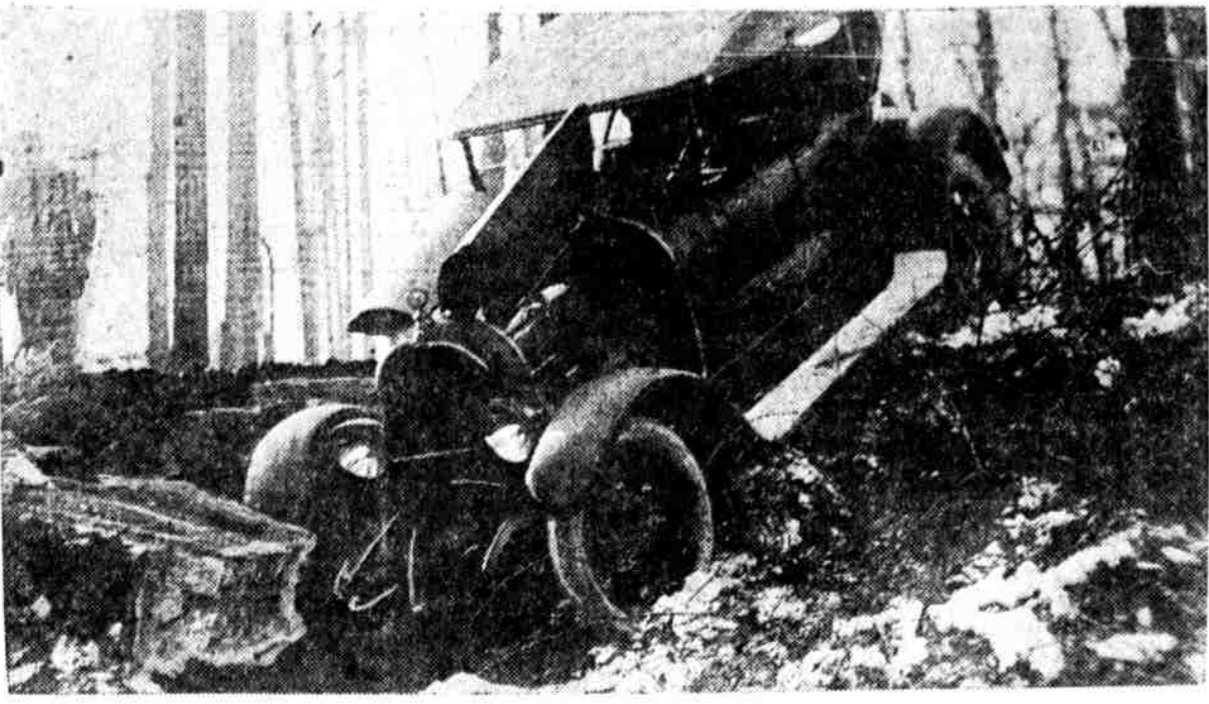
ALEX. SELLERS HURT WITH HIS WIFE IN CRASH AT ARDMORE
