

### SEE INTERNATIONAL ECONOMIC COUNCIL

Lloyd George and Briand May Even Come to United States Together

LONDON PRESS APPROVES

London, Dec. 13.—Rumors of the possibility of an international economic conference in Washington, which have been current here during the last few days, are the subject of comment in the London morning newspapers today.

It is not assumed that such a conference has been decided upon, but the success of the Armament Conference has aroused hopes that the economic troubles of Europe might be settled by a similar gathering.

Connected with the rumors are more or less vague reports that Prime Minister Lloyd George and Premier Briand, of France, intend to go to Washington together after the French Premier's visit here next week.

The Daily Mail claims to have received official information from Downing Street that Mr. Lloyd George is unlikely to go to America for some months, but instead proposes taking a vacation trip to Southern France after the coming Parliament session.

On the other hand, the Times says: "The suggestion is hazarded that after next week's conferences with Mr. Briand Mr. Lloyd George might not deem the moment inopportune to lay the whole question of the needs of shattered Europe before President Harding, who undoubtedly has the warmest sympathy for the stricken Continent."

"Should Mr. Lloyd George take the initiative in appealing to him to summon another conference to consider world economic and financial conditions, the appeal, it is thought, might not be unavailing."

It is believed in any case that the conversations between the British and French Premiers next week will raise a wider range than the single question of German reparations, and this supposition is largely the basis of today's press speculation concerning a possible new conference in America.

The Daily Telegraph while not regarding such a conference as yet more than an idea, says the idea has very considerable popular support.

The Morning Post's financial editor, forecasting some sort of international economic conference before long, says: "Such a conference, if participated in by America, would undoubtedly be a

welcome development." He does not see much hope in such a step, however, urging that "the principle of self-help is indispensable to working out the problem."

The Westminster Gazette thinks that, provided an agreement can be reached between Mr. Briand and Mr. Lloyd George, there would be an enormous gain to the world if America consented to become a party to discussions of reparations questions.

POND DRAGGED FOR AUTOS

Believed Owners Seeking Insurance Damaged Machines Into Quarry

Lansdale, Dec. 13.—While hundreds of residents of the North Penn section watch police authorities are directing the dragging of the bottom of a quarry pond at Oreville, about three miles above Lansdale, in search of an automobile.

According to those at work at the quarry pond—which is about forty feet deep—at least one auto is at the bottom and it is believed there are more dumped there by owners after insurance.

Up to the present time, the top of an automobile has been hooked from the pond, and Sunday an automobile or some other heavy object was drawn part way to the surface when the rope broke.

### BRITISH HEIR VISITS 'CITY OF THE DEAD'

Complete Boycott by Natives Marks Arrival of Prince at Allahabad

FESTOONED CITY DESERTED

Special Cable Dispatch, Copyright, 1921—London, Dec. 13.—A complete boycott by the natives yesterday marked the Prince of Wales' visit to Allahabad, India. Obdient to Gandhi's orders, the natives proclaimed a day of mourning when the Prince arrived, refusing to attend the ceremonies incident to the royal visit.

No violence or other outbreaks were reported there, but it is stated that threats, intimidations and terrorism were used by the native extremists to prevent the people from attending the welcome. There was a remarkable scene when the Prince arrived yesterday. Instead of tumultuous cheering crowds, such as have greeted it elsewhere, the royal party arrived in what was apparently a city of the dead.

All the streets along the Prince's route were heavily guarded by troops. The main thoroughfares were gaily decorated with flags and banners emblazoned with patriotic inscriptions. But the brilliant spectacle was empty of life, the only spectators being a few thousand Europeans. The entire native population had observed Gandhi's order. They shunned the principal streets, remaining indoors behind shuttered windows. After a formal reception at the Government house the Prince left in the afternoon for Benares.

Meanwhile a wave of unrest is sweeping India from the Khyber Pass to the Malabar Coast. It is like nothing in India's past. It embraces all castes and innumerable sub-castes, most religions and sects, and mutually hostile races, and it is ever-increasing, as did Russian discontent in 1917.

The word is passing throughout the land that the British regime is about to depart. Gandhi, the nationalist leader,

repeatedly has favored this notion by setting dates for the beginning of self-rule. He set it for August 11, after one year of the non-co-operative movement, and in August the Moplahs took him literally and revolted.

He has set it again for January 11. Who will revolt then? As the Moplah rising was born of exasperation after long waiting, so a few moderates believe that all India—or at least, radical Bengal—will lose patience at another postponement and act for itself. Some think that the restless masses will turn upon Gandhi. His hold upon them, however, is strong at this time.

An official communique, issued last night, stated that arrests of agitators have been made in Allahabad, Delhi, Hangook and Mandalay. It is reported that in a fight near Calcutta yesterday a Suffolk regiment defeated a band of Moplahs, killing eighty-three and capturing fifteen.
