government, and that reorganization plans are being considered.

league's financial condition.

Frank M. Riter, newly elected chairman of the league, today minimized re-ports of financial difficulties. He de-

clared the league is growing stronger every day, and that its backers have no thought of giving up the civic campaign it inaugurated last June.






