Emily Gray Wins \$500 Prize at State College and Plans Long

Will Combine Missionary and Agricultural Teachings In

"I wouldn't make them listen to me aik without showing them what I could do." said Miss Emily Ashton Gray when asked why, as a student of agriculture, she plans to do missionary work in

India.

Miss Gray, of 3724 North Tenth street, who is in her senior year at the Agricultural School at Penn State Col-Agricultural School at Fenn State College, has been awarded a prize of \$500 by the Dairy and Husbandry Department. The prize was given for proficiency in agricultural work, and will enable Miss Gray to carry out her am-

Two years ago this and similar scholarships were established by P. M. Sharples, of West Chester, in ten State agricultural colleges, to train women for

dairy work.
Since the award Emily Gray has assiduously been studying cows and their South Carolina have been transferred "I've been milking them for the last

few weeks, although we really don't have to do that," said Miss Gray. She looks like a very modern and efficient milkmaid, with her short, bobbed hair and blue-gray eyes.
"If I go to India, it will be much easier to take care of my hair if it is short," she explained.

The dream of going to India is an old one, Miss Gray says. After she graduated from the Germantown High School in 1918, she went to State College. The young student had always wanted to do missionary work, and her connection with the Student Volunteer Movement at State College further heightened this desire. She explained that the women in India do the large part of the agricultural work, and, therefore, she believes the best way to

therefore, she believes the best way to reach these less fortunate women is on the ground they know best.

"The only way to do missionary work," she says, "Is to be of the people and live and work with them."

Before attempting to realize her ambition of going to India, there will have to be more years of study, and perhaps where time separt in teaching dairy a short time spent in teaching dairy work and husbandry here in the United




