

BRIDGE FETE PLANS GET O. K. IN CAMDEN

Civic Groups Meet and Arrange to Co-operate in January 6 Event

A hearty spirit of co-operation by officials, business men and civic bodies of Camden toward making the celebration marking the start of physical construction of the Delaware River Bridge, January 6, a success, was shown at a meeting of the organizers last night at the Camden City Hall.

It was announced today that Camden would have at least a dozen floats in the parade which will precede the ceremonies at 11 P. M. Philadelphia side where the work will start.

The floats will practically tell the story of Camden's progress industrially and educationally. Among organizations to be represented will be the Chamber of Commerce, Civic Federation, Rotary Club, Lions Club, Real Estate Board and several suburbs, including Audubon, N. J.

The parade in Camden will precede the one to be held in Philadelphia. Mayor Ellis and other officials of Camden will greet Mayor Moore and officials of Philadelphia and Pennsylvania on the New Jersey side of the river at 9:30 o'clock. The Philadelphia officials will have precedence in the line of march in Camden, after which the parade will proceed to the principal central business sections of Philadelphia.

There will be a luncheon at the Bellevue-Stratford for members of the Bridge Commission, to be followed by ceremonies on the pier. Full details of the day's event will be decided on this week at a joint meeting of officials of both cities.
