Telegram Corroborates Story of Slaying in Georgia Camp

CLUBBED, SHOT IN BACK

By the Associated Press Washington, Dec. 21.—Called today as the first in a second list of witnesses in the Senate committee investigation of charges by Senator Watson that American soldiers had been hanged without trial in Europe, Major J. Wallis, of Athens, Ga., declared he saw a corporal shoot and kill a private soldier at Camp Wheeler.

Called "Family Row" Some of the charges against Wallis were that he had been "clubbed" and "shot in the back" by a private soldier.

Got Thirtys Day Furlough Wallis, however, had no furlough at the time of the shooting, and he was not on a thirty-day furlough.

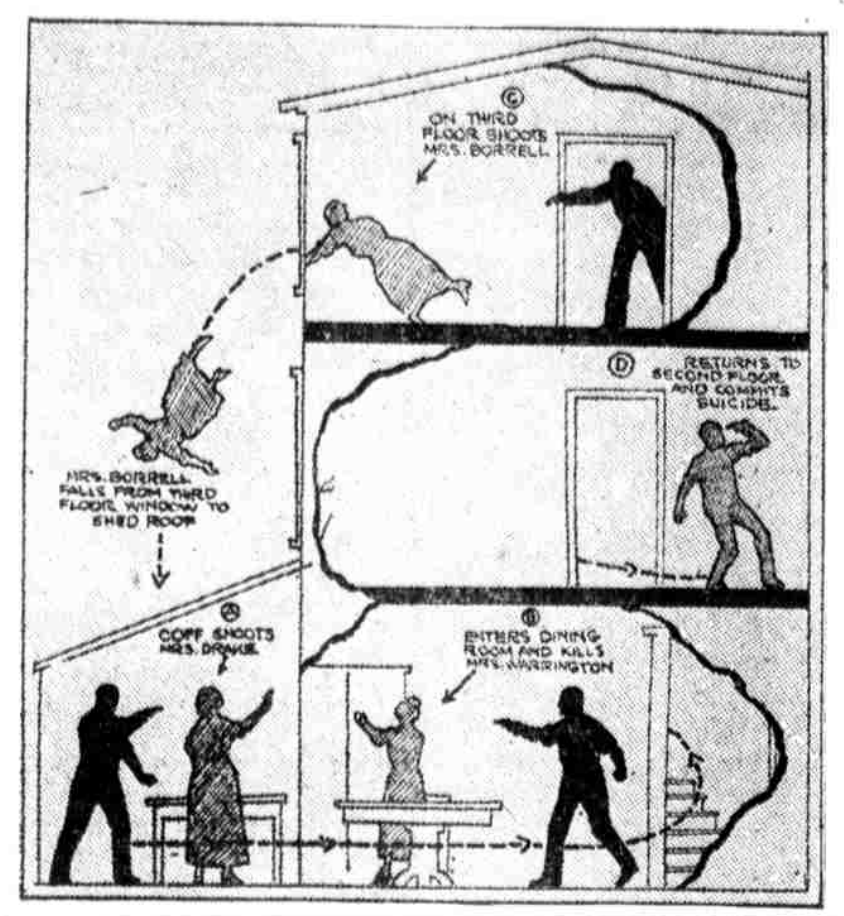
