The materials are the most magnificent of the season—duvetyne and deep-plaid chevrons, in the loveliest rich grays and browns and blues, with occasionally a lighter or brighter tone. And these col-

ors are set off by splendid massive fur—beaver, Australian opossum, wolf, natural and dyed squirrel, mole and caracul.

As a rule the garments are distinctly of the wrap type; some of them are cap coats, some have bloused backs; and the large armpit hole is very frequent.

Clearaway of Girls' Dresses and Coats 6 to 16 Year Sizes

About 120 dresses for girls of six to 16 years have been greatly lowered in price for quick disposal.

One group now \$3.75 to \$25 is made up of dainty voiles, organdies, ginghams, taffetas, Georgette crepe and crepe de chine, in white and colors. They include charming little dance and party frocks, and plainer ones for "best" and every day wear. The reductions on these range from one-quarter to one-half former prices.

Another group, now \$10 to \$25, includes serges, jersey, velveteens and velvets. They are one or two of a kind, and are mostly navy blue or brown, with a few black velvets. On these the reductions average one-third.

About 30 coats in six to fourteen year sizes are also lowered in price. One or two of a kind, in navy blue, brown, reindeer, sorrento blue and volnay red. Some of them have fur collars—beaver, opossum or squirrel. The new lower prices are \$23.50, \$35, \$38, \$55 and \$85.
