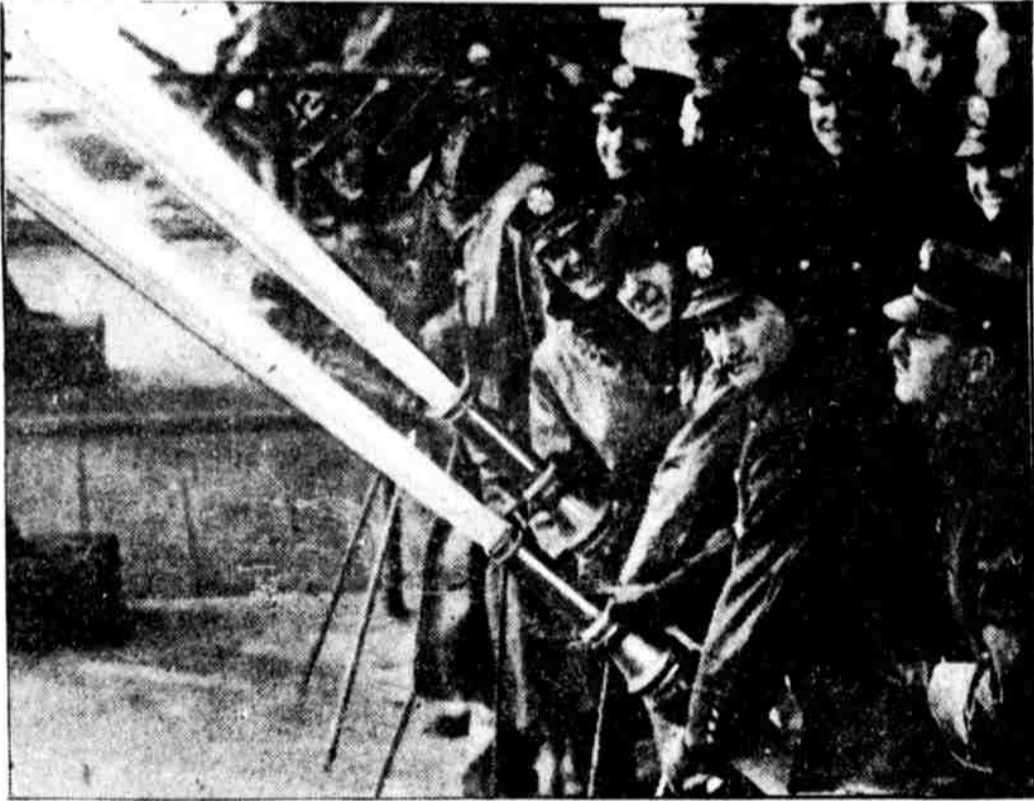


CAN YOU RECALL THIS BIT OF OLD PHILADELPHIA?

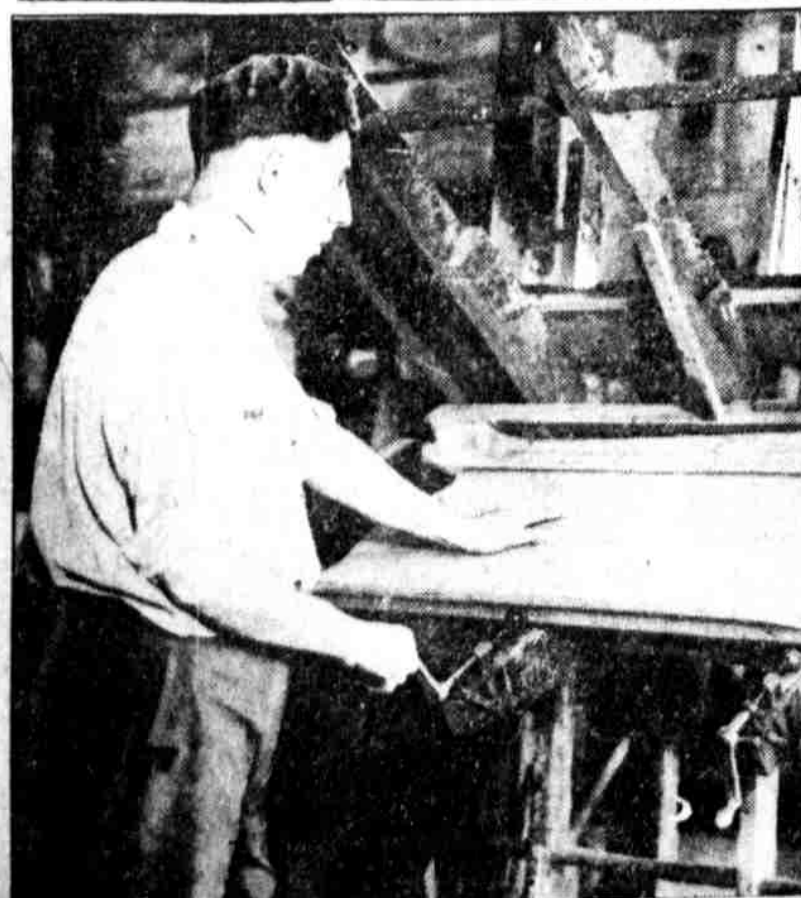

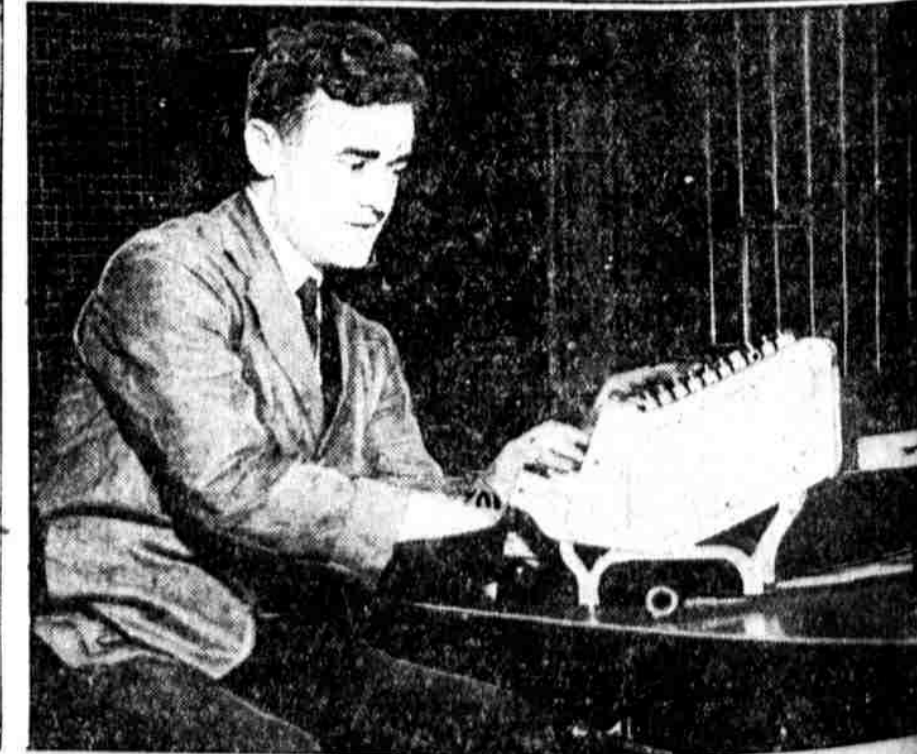
