

\$65,000,000 RAISED BY CITY LAST YEAR

Hadley Points Out Great Number of Uses to Which Money Is Put

FUNDED DEBT \$202,000,000

Funds are available in old existing loans for a vast amount of public improvement, according to Controller Hadley, in his statement covering the financial condition of the city.

The city's funded debt outstanding at the close of 1921 there is approximately \$15,400,000 of these four funds under contract, including such projects as the Franklin elevated, the construction of modern bridges, Art Museum and Free Library, and grading and paving of streets and other permanent improvements.

SHE HOLDS RATS IN HER HANDS

Only woman research professor in the United States, at Wistar Institute, is proving that wild rats will breed in captivity and through evolution change their natural brown coats for ones gray or mottled. Some rats are positively handsome, she says.

WOMEN AFRAID OF RATS? HERE'S ONE WHO RAISES 'EM

But Dr. King Has Upset a Lot of Traditions—Now She's Proving That the Wild Little Creatures Will Breed in Captivity

The woman who has already upset the age-old tradition that women are afraid of rats and mice and who explained the theory that intermarriage caused the race to deteriorate may soon expose the scientific fallacy that wild rats will not breed in captivity.

Dr. Helen Dean King, of the Wistar Institute, the only woman in this country to hold a research professorship, is now engaged in an experiment never before undertaken.

Many are the works on wild and domestic animals and on the probable evolution of the domestic animal, but no one so far has undertaken to breed a domestic animal directly from a wild state until Dr. King started her work on that problem six years ago.

She has succeeded in producing several generations of gray rats in the experimental laboratory in spite of the theory that wild rats would not breed in captivity and has noted differences in each successive generation, which show that natural evolution can be simulated in the laboratory.

Dr. King, armed with a pair of long forceps, gently shows the visitor through her rat colony and stops to open a cage here and there to take out a particular rat and point out its beauty.
