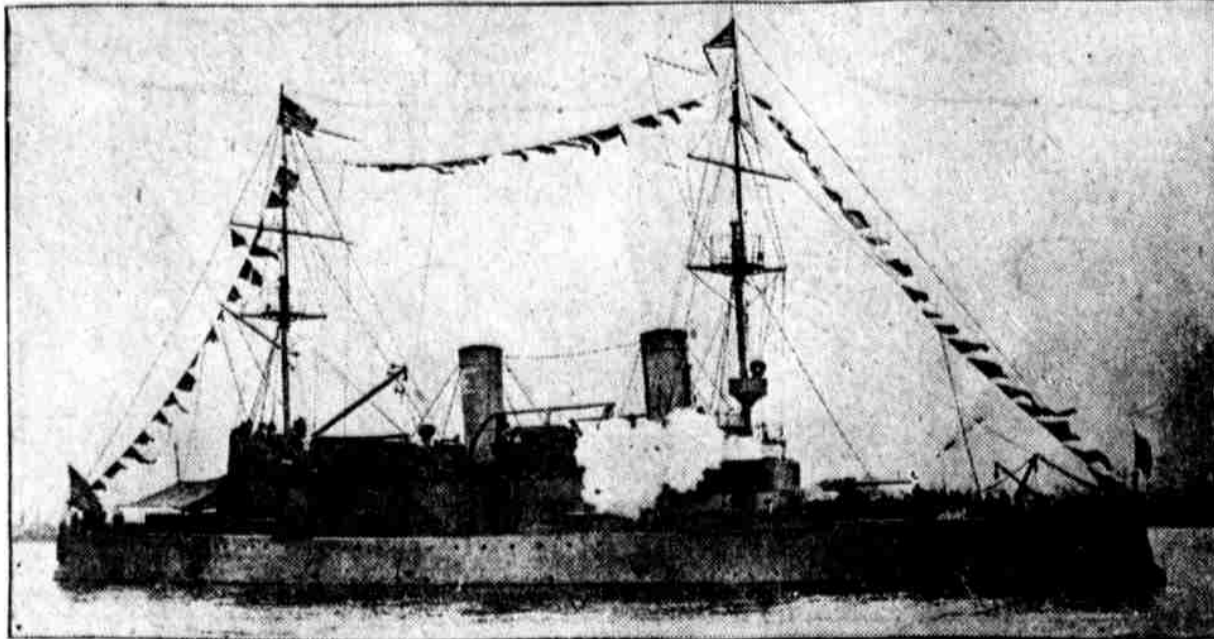
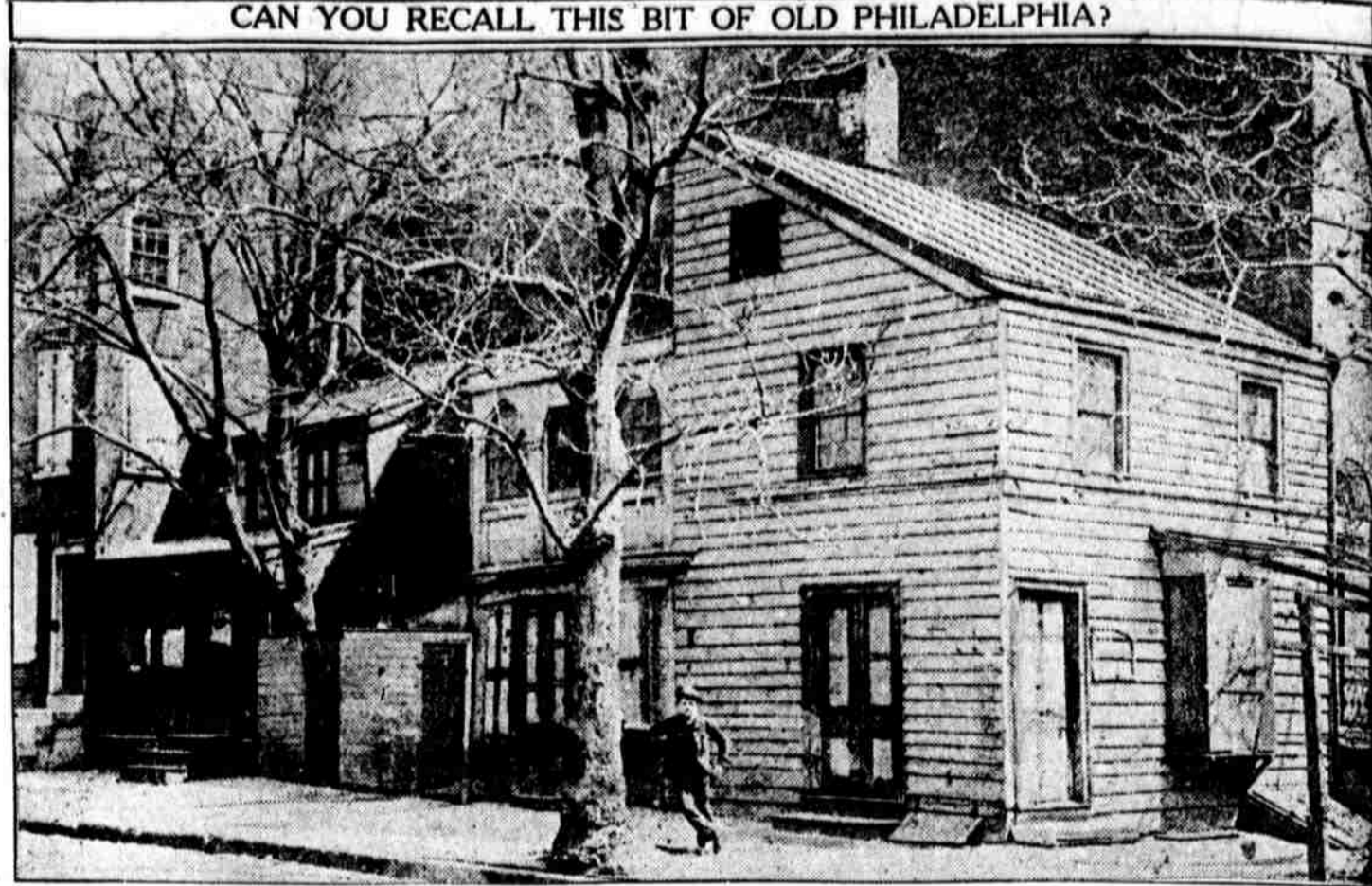

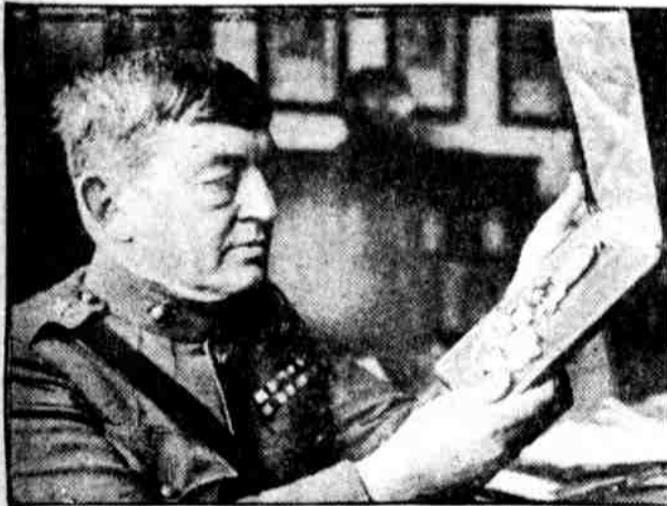


THE SALUTE. Anchored in midstream in the Delaware River, the battleship Olympia represented the navy in the Delaware Bridge ceremony.

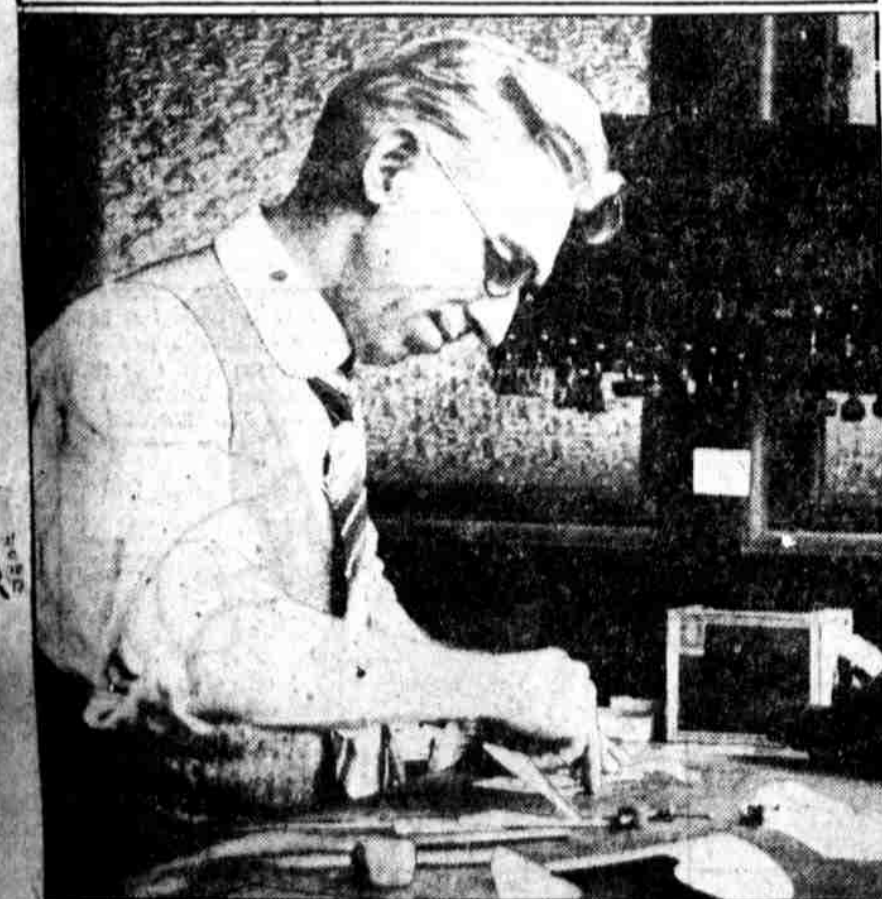
