

#### Sproul Declares He Expects Appointee to Seek Election in November

George Wharton Pepper, of this city, was named United States Senator to succeed Senator Penrose by Governor Sproul today.

The announcement was made by the Covernor as he bourded a train at Swarthmore after a capid motorcar trip ever snow-covered roads from his home, Lapidea Manor, near Chester. The Gevernor said he hoped Mr. Pepper would be a candidate for Senstor Penrose's unexpired term. The appointment itself qualifies the new Sensior to serve until a candidate is elected in November for the Penrose term ending March 4, 1927.

The certificate of appointment was handed to Mr. Pepper in the Governor's business office, at 1512 Chestnut street. Arrangements have been made to have the new Senator take the oath at Washingion tomorrow.
