HUSKY TUNNEY GRABS TITLE FROM LEVINSKY

Greenwich Village Youth Breezes to Victory Over Philadelphia Battler

DRAW FOR FULTON

JAFFE New York, Jan. 14.—Friday, the 13th, failed to prove a jinx for the so-called experts of fistfighting, and the draw was upheld when Gene Tunney, twenty-three-year-old husky, outboxed the Gotham's Greenwich Village section, awakened this morning America's light-heavyweight champion, at the same time, hostess of Fred Fulton, the Philadelphia pugilist, for a crack at Jack Dempsey's title as undisputed champion of the world.

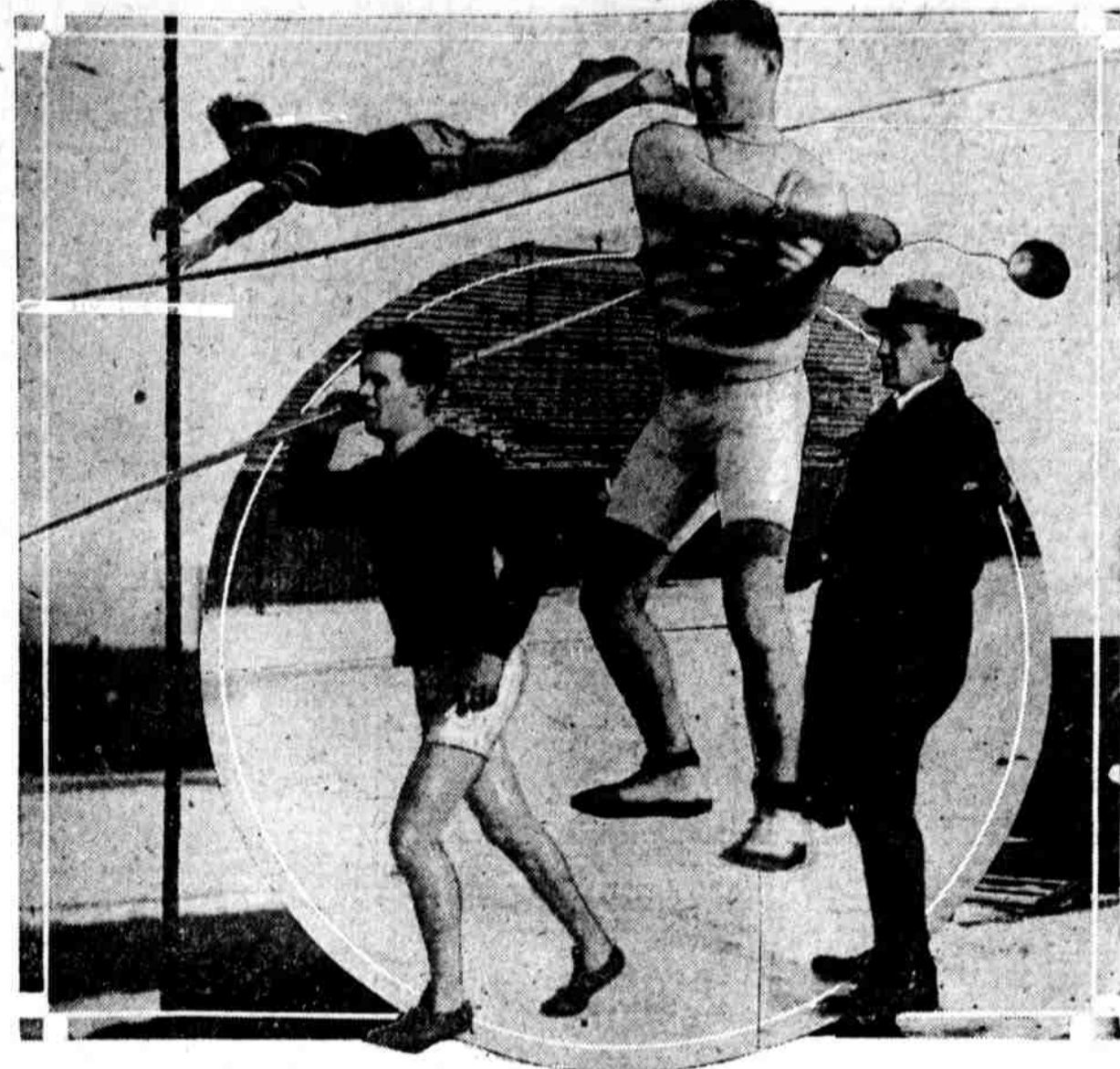
