

# DRYS TO CELEBRATE 2 YEARS' DROUGHT

W. C. T. U. to Have Special Prohibition Exercises at Arch Street Headquarters

## HOPE FOR ENFORCEMENT

Today Philadelphia and the Nation generally celebrate the second anniversary of two years dry—or rather under dry legislation.

The Women's Christian Temperance Union has planned big things for today, among which is the annual roll-call, supper and social meeting to be held at the Willard, 1521 Arch street when a resume of the work done will be discussed.

Literature containing definite proof of the advantages to have accrued to the country as a result of prohibition laws will be freely distributed by the organization and gratitude will be expressed.

Miss Anna A. Gordon, world natural president of the W. C. T. U. says "Big business, as well as health and welfare authorities, are daily becoming more enthusiastic and willing to admit that prohibition is proving a success and contributing greatly to a better and more wholesome financial and economic conditions in the country."

Efforts toward law enforcement will be the chief aim of the W. C. T. U. during the next year, according to Miss Gordon.

## STATE COLLEGE STUDENTS INDORSE PARLEY RESULTS

Fifty Other Schools to Present Resolutions to Harding

State College, Pa., Jan. 16.—Resolutions setting forth an expression of "unqualified approval of the Washington Armament Conference and the results that Conference has achieved," were adopted at a meeting of Pennsylvania State College students at chapel exercises last night.

E. E. Overdorf, head of the Pennsylvania State student government will join student chairmen of fifty other States in presenting that similar resolutions from many colleges to President Harding in Washington on February 1.

The student resolutions further urge the delegates to "insist for future world conferences through which the possibility of war may be avoided whereby the vast amount of money and energy expended by the nations in armaments may hereafter be conserved for the development, rather than to the destruction, of civilization and the human race."

## SUNDAY SCHOOL GAINS 200

Messiah Lutherans in a Contest to Increase Membership

A gain of 200 members in one week was announced in the enrollment count yesterday in the Messiah Lutheran Sunday School, Sixteenth and Jefferson streets. The Rev. Ross Stover and Harvey C. The goal set for the school is 1000 members, and when the contest began a week ago there were 450 members. Mr. Miller announced a total of 650 yesterday.
