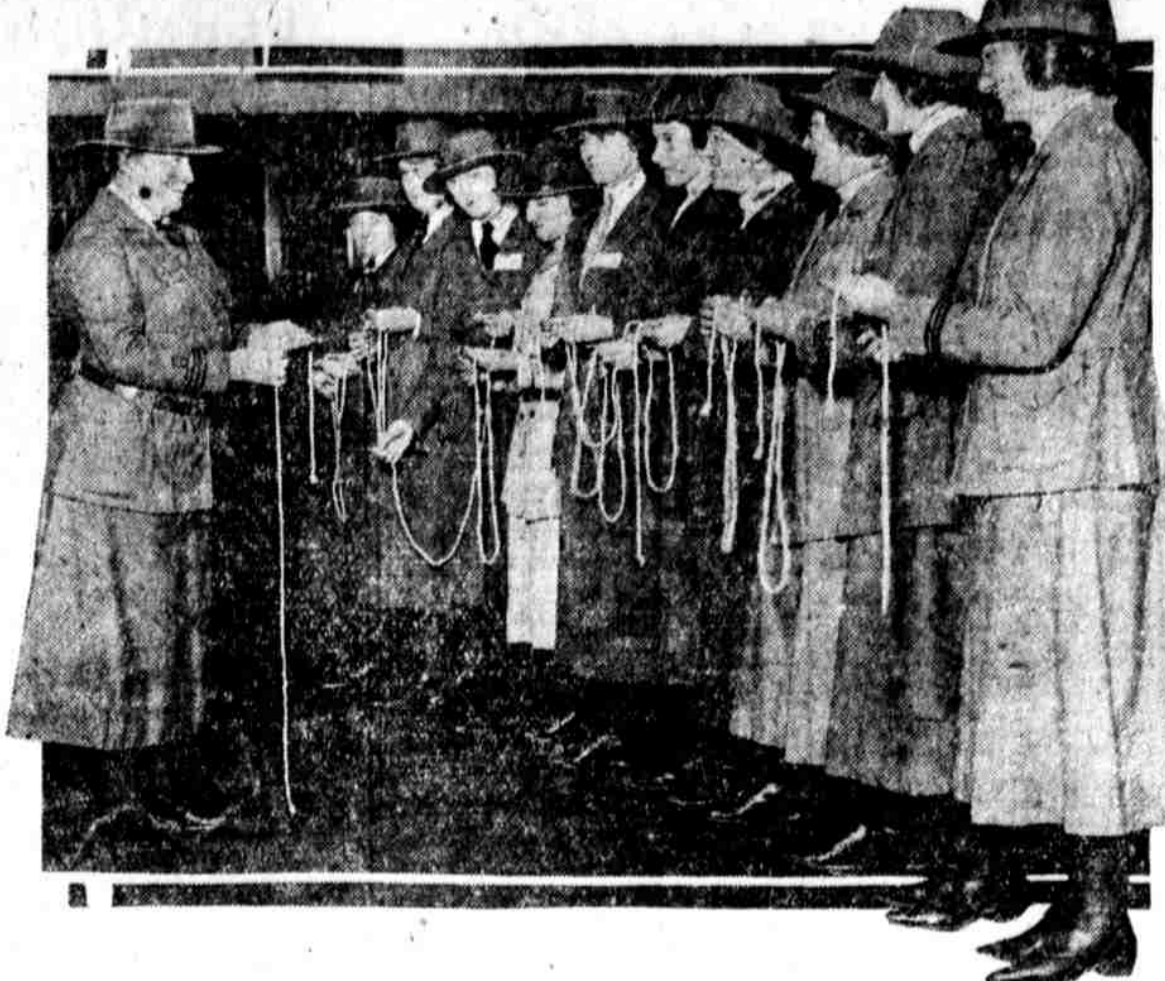
The bond market last week underwent what was popularly termed a right-about-face. Prices moved up sharply and there was a big demand for bonds than had been in evidence previously for several days.
