

1,000,000 HELD NEEDED FOR FAIR

Congress Group Sees Council's Action as Aid Toward U. S. Recognition

WILL ASK BIG FEDERAL SUM

Members of the Philadelphia delegation in Congress will urge that the Federal Government appropriate a large sum for the support of the Sesqui-Centennial Exposition.

Supporters of the fair at the capital received with delight the news that the Council had pledged \$5,000,000 and as much more as may be needed.

They are glad that Council saw, without dissent, the advisability of announcing its readiness to appropriate more money if necessary.

Leaders in the fair movement at Washington say that action will mean aid for the time comes to seek Federal aid for the project.

They declare frankly that the \$5,000,000 will not be enough. One member of Congress estimates that there will be at least \$40,000,000 available from four sources—Council, the State, Congress and private citizens.
