Held in Murder



FRANK DORIS Was denied bail today at his hearing before Magistrate Renshaw in connection with the slaying of John Villano, in the apartment of Margaret Hastings in Walnut street, last Wednesday night. The picture was taken at the hearing.

The woman was not at the hearing and her name was not mentioned. Before a throng of spectators, attracted by this and the Rosier murder case, both of which had preliminary hearings today, Doris was brought into court with his counsel, Ephraim Lipschultz, of John R. K. Scott's office. He viewed his surroundings with interest and did not evince the slightest concern.

He testified he had tried to see the wounded man before the latter's death, but was told by the physician that the man's condition was such as to require an ante-mortem statement. Later, he said, Villano suddenly relapsed and died of his wound without making any statement.
