Edwin E. Kohn, head of the brokerage firm of Edwin E. Kohu, 1322 Walnot street, which falled Samurday, has absconded with large sums of money, according to the receivers. He is be-Heyed to be in San Francisco.

The charge was made today before Judge Dickinson, in the United States District Court, when Assistant District Attorney Kun and Edmand Kirby. representing the receivers, appeared and informed the Court that the fathers was a "gigantic frond." They appealed to Judge Dickinson to appoint homediately a special referee in bankruptcy to consave something from the rain.

The Court immediates appointed Walter C. Douglas as referee. Attorneys for the creditors also succeeded in climinating George E. Kohn a son of the broker, a "paper partner," from the proceedings. Judge Dickinson was told that he is a minor, who is
