

Failure 'Gigantic Fraud,' Court Hears—Start Probe by Special Referee MOST ALL ASSETS VANISH

Edwin E. Kohn, head of the brokerage firm of Edwin E. Kohn, 1322 Walnut street, which failed Saturday, has absconded with large sums of money, according to the referees. He is believed to be in San Francisco. The charge was made today before Judge Dickinson in the United States District Court, when Assistant District Attorney Kim and Edmund Kirby, representing the receivers, appeared and informed the court that the failure was a "gigantic fraud." They appealed to Judge Dickinson to appoint immediately a special referee to conduct an investigation in an endeavor to recover something from the firm. The court immediately appointed Walter C. Douglas as referee. Attorneys for the receivers also succeeded in eliminating George E. Kohn, a son of the broker, a "paper partner," from the proceedings. Judge Dickinson was told that he was a partner who was holding with no funds and nothing could be obtained should he be apprehended. The court finally ordered the name of the boy removed from the proceedings.

A petition was filed today by Assistant City Solicitor Rosenbaum with the Public Service Commission, requesting it to order the P. R. T. Company to file a complete report showing its revenues and expenses for last year.

The petition points out that the commission had ordered the company to submit an offer of a tariff schedule providing for a seven-cent fare monthly reports of its receipts and expenditures, and to provide better service for the riding public.

Among other things, the petition stated: "For upward of a year negotiations have been proceeding between the city and the company, but no definite action of an operating agreement for the Frankford elevated railway and Biscleton surface line.
