

## LINDSLEY TO NAME HIS LEGION AIDES

Appointment of Committee Memberships is Awaited With Interest

### POST PLANS BUILDING

Members of all American Legion posts are waiting with great interest and some anxiety for the appointments that are to be made by the committee headed by B. Lindsley, the newly elected county chairman. Plans for the building of a new post at the corner of 17th and Morris Sts. have been approved at a meeting Monday night. Harry Curtis, owner of the lot, offered it to the Legion for a nominal sum. Funds for the erection of the building will be raised by a committee headed by W. B. Clare. A plan for the building will be contributed by T. W. Mattin, a city engineer.

The Charles C. McHenry Post, 178, is to build at the corner of 17th and Craig streets, Holmesburg, a memorial building to be used as a meeting place for the post and for public purposes. Plans for this building were approved at a meeting Monday night.

The idea of amalgamation had strong supporters in both organizations, and the approval of Franklin D'Olier, past national commander of the Legion, both the posts are prosperous and draw their memberships from the central section of the city.

At a meeting held early in the week the question was discussed in every phase. The conclusion, indorsed by a majority vote of the memberships of both posts, was that the Franklin Post would be better to lend its strength to some one of the smaller posts, that for lack of members or funds are in danger of dissolution.

### N. J. ASSEMBLY ENDS MAR. 16

Senate Votes \$25,000 for State Building at Sesqui-Centennial

Trenton, Feb. 8.—The New Jersey Assembly will conclude its 102d session at 11 o'clock Thursday night, March 16, under the terms of a concurrent resolution adopted in both branches of the Legislature yesterday.

A concurrent resolution introduced just before adjournment in the Assembly would petition Congress to pass legislation permitting the manufacture and sale of light wines and beers. Another resolution seeks to change the terms of Assembly members from one to two years.

The bill appropriating \$25,000 for a State building at the Sesqui-Centennial in Philadelphia was passed by the Senate.

A bill introduced by Assemblyman Moore, of Mercer County, would repeal the direct primary law and substitute nomination of all public officers from Governor down to the smallest ward officer by direct petition.

Special message from Governor Edwards urged passage of Senator Simpson's bill to restore the pre-war five-cent trolley fare.

### GUARD OFFICERS APPROVED

Generals Price, Miner and Coulter Among Those Recognized by Weeks

Washington, Feb. 8.—The War Department yesterday extended "final recognition" as required under the army reorganization act, to six appointees as general officers in the National Guard. The officers, whose appointments were approved formally today, were Major General John F. O'Ryan, New York; Major General William Price, Chester, Pa.; Brigadier General A. Miner, Wilkes-Barre; Brigadier General Franklin W. Ward, Albany; Brigadier General Richard Coulter, Greensburg, Pa., and Brigadier General Charles E. McPherson, of Durant, Okla.

Secretary Weeks also announced that among others selected for nomination as generals in the officers' reserve corps were the following officers: Brigadier General V. B. Metz, Raleigh, N. C.; Colonel John H. Rice, retired, Washington, and Lieutenant Colonel Lincoln C. Andrews, U. S. A., retired, Rye, N. Y.

### WOMAN KILLED BY BOY

Coroner's Jury Decides Shooting of Young Wife Was Accidental

Waynesboro, Pa., Feb. 8.—While playing with an automatic pistol at the home of his uncle, Russell Steinbaugh, on Philadelphia avenue, Monday evening, Harold Black, fifteen years old, shot and killed Mrs. Steinbaugh, twenty-two years old.

Mr. Steinbaugh and taken out, as he thought, all the cartridges. One remained, however, and when the boy picked up the weapon it was in some way discharged. Mrs. Steinbaugh lived but a few minutes.

Mr. Steinbaugh and the boy were locked up overnight. Coroner Kintner held an inquest yesterday and the jury returned a verdict of accidental shooting.
