TAX ALL PROPERTY, N. J. BOARD URGES. Owners of New Houses May Even Have to Pay Arrears.

COURT RULING TO CUT RATE. Trenton, March 3.—Following a decision of the Supreme Court setting aside the law of 1920 exempting from taxes for five years dwellings erected between October 1, 1920, and October 1, 1922, the State Board of Taxes and Assessment, through its assessor, Frank D. Schroth, today advised all county tax boards to immediately re-estimate the taxable rates for all buildings erected under that law.
