PROHIBITION NAVY TO BEGIN AT ONCE
 Secretary Mellon Approves Use of "Borrowed" Submarine Chasers
TO CHECK BOOZE IMPORTS

 Washington, March 10.—Submarine chasers, coast guard cutters and an augmented force of prohibition and revenue officers along the Atlantic coast are being organized for a drive on rum runners and liquor smugglers from Florida to New England.
 Commissioner Haynes and his assistants have been making an intensive study of the smuggling problem for several weeks, with the result that they think they have devised a system to keep "booze" importations down to a minimum.
 It is recognized that smuggling is one of the three principal sources of liquor supply and if this can be dealt with as effectively as warehouse withdrawal and diversion of alcohol, which subsequently becomes the basis of synthetic whisky, the principal obstacles to prohibition enforcement will have been overcome.
 Officials said today eight or nine submarine chasers, "borrowed" from the navy and no longer of value for naval purposes will be put to work at once in controlling the coast for rum runners. Secretary of the Treasury Mellon has approved the plans of the prohibition unit for this experiment, and the submarine fleet has already won the sobriquet of "the prohibition navy."
 The vessels will be manned by revenue officers and prohibition agents, and officials believe should be able to run down and catch all but the speediest yachts.
 As they are navigable in all kinds of weather and will survive heavy seas, they are expected to prove an effective instrument in checking smuggling operations.
 Commissioner Haynes, in consultation with Federal Prohibition Director Day, of New York, has also worked out a scheme to prevent the operation of "floating palaces" or "floating bars" just outside the three-mile limit along the coast. This practice and the operations of smugglers in transferring large quantities of liquor to faster vessels beyond the three-mile limit have been a source of constant trouble and annoyance to prohibition authorities.
 Under a customs law enacted in 1890 officials here believe it will be possible to seize any of these "booze" ships anywhere within twelve miles of the shore. They are convinced that a ferry service between the shore and any vessel stationed more than twelve miles out would involve so many difficulties as to make it impracticable.
 Discussing the smuggling problem, Mr. Haynes said:
 "It is generally admitted that smugglers have been supplying virtually the only high-grade liquor which has been available to the bootlegger and to his customers. Without a plan of co-operation with the foreign governments in helping to check this influx, the problem has been a particularly aggravating and troublesome one."
 "It has been an especially difficult task because of the fact that our facilities have not been well adapted to such a campaign. However, in a very large measure we have overcome these obstacles, which have been under consideration for many months, and we believe that just as we have approached the solution of illegal withdrawals of liquor and the wholesale diversion of alcohol even so will we be able at a not very distant date to have the smuggling source well under control."

PRINCES FOR ADOPTION
 Noble Families in Russia Unable to Care for Their Children
 Moscow, March 16.—(By A. P.)—Little Princes and Princesses, many of the score are available in Russia for adoption by wealthy foreigners. The parents, where there are any, are willing, and even anxious, to have their children go because of their own poverty and inability properly to care for and educate them.
 The mother of little Chah Khan, Prince of Persia, is one of the many who are willing to part with their sons. Prince Kadjar's great-grandfather was one of two brothers who disputed the Persian throne. When he failed he fled to Russia, where the family became of some political consequence.
 Many mothers say that, unless they find real means of getting their children abroad, the careers of the little ones will be ruined. If ever private property is returned to the original owners, these children will recover vast estates.

ROCKS FALL 'FROM CLOUDS'
 Mysterious Shower of Stones Bombeds Chico, Calif., Warehouse
 Chico, Calif., March 10.—(By A. P.)—Showers of rocks that fell "from the clouds" in a warehouse here have baffled the police, neighbors and various official and unofficial investigators. Today J. W. Charge, owner of the warehouse, posted the offer of a reward of \$200 to the person revealing the source of the rocks.
 While the town marshal and others were examining the corrugated iron roof yesterday a shower of large smooth rocks fell, sending the investigators scurrying for cover.
 Others, standing on the street at the time, declared the rocks seemed to come straight from the clouds. The mysterious bombardments have occurred periodically for three weeks.

15 KILLED ON TRANSPORT
 Hand Grenades Explode on Soviet Transport at Trebizond
 Constantinople, March 10.—(By A. P.)—Fifteen of the crew of the Bolshevik transport Gorki were killed and many wounded when the ship's cargo of hand grenades exploded at Trebizond, on the Black Sea. The explosion also did some damage to the town, where great quantities of munitions have been received lately from Russia.

Truck and Household Goods Burn
 Reading, Pa., March 10.—A five-ton truck belonging to Jacoby & Son, of Philadelphia, overturned last night, caught fire and was destroyed. The truck was moving household goods from the coal piers to Philadelphia. The loss is about \$3000.
Baptists Plan \$15,000,000 Drive
 Chicago, March 10.—The Executive Committee of the Northern Baptist Convention met yesterday to complete plans for a campaign to raise \$15,000,000 within two months to defray expenses of the annual meeting in June and to carry on the work of the organization on a larger scale. It is planned to reach every member of the denomination in the United States by April 30.
