

"SPECIAL" ALIENS GIVEN EXEMPTION

Temporary Permits Expiring March 23 Are Indefinitely Extended

SCATTERED ALL OVER U. S.

Washington, March 20.—About 2500 aliens admitted into the United States under temporary permits that would expire March 23 and have them liable to immediate deportation have been given an indefinite extension of time for their stay. Commissioner General Hubbard, of the Immigration Bureau, announced today.

An executive order was issued Saturday for the purpose. Hubbard explained, because an act that passed the House last week, and is expected to pass the Senate shortly, provides for the admission of the aliens concerned into the United States without regard to provisions of the general law restricting immigration.

In practically all cases the aliens concerned, who represent almost every European nationality and in addition have a percentage of Asians among their number, such as Syrians and Armenians and Greeks, landed in the United States after the legal number of individuals of their nationalities admissible to the United States had been exhausted.

Religious Bodies Aid
As a result of special representations of relatives in the United States and religious bodies, the requirement for immediate deportation was not enforced against them, though in the case of one shipload of Hungarians, the Canadian Steamship Company and the Government had a controversy over the circumstances of their arrival.

The immigrants, after release at the ports of arrival, scattered over the United States, and the cost of assembling them for deportation, as well as the humanitarian objections to sending them back to the countries of departure, have induced the enactment of the special legislation.

Commissioner Hubbard, in cooperation with the Senate Committee on Immigration, has practically completed preparation of amendments to the pending General Immigration Bill, designed to extend the provisions of the existing quota law.

Provision for Certificates
These amendments are designed to eliminate situations such as the one that occasioned the executive order. If the proposals are approved by the Senate and House, aliens desiring to enter the United States on July 1 will have to get from the American Consul in their country of residence a certificate that will show that the quota of immigrants to the United States in which they are enumerated has not been exhausted.

Steamship companies or others transporting such aliens to the United States without such a certificate would be liable to fine and other penalties. Immigration authorities consider that adoption of some such plan would prevent the disappointment and hardship suffered by many individuals who abandoned their former means of livelihood, sold property and severed family and business relationships to come to the United States, only to find themselves inadmissible.

ELECTROCUTE WIFE-SLAYER

Albert White Says "Good-by" Without Tremor in Voice
Hellefonte, Pa., March 20.—By A. P.—Albert Terrence White, convicted in Lawrence County for the murder of his wife early in 1921, was electrocuted at the Hellefonte Penitentiary this morning. When White was brought here on Saturday he was accompanied by his spiritual adviser, but the latter returned home and White was pronounced to the chair by the Rev. T. W. Young, captain of the penitentiary.

He walked to the chair unshaken, removed, and without a tremor said "good-by" to all. The first conducter made at 7:45 and the executioner White was pronounced dead.
