He charged that the British Army, during the Lim-erick difficulty, had assisted the Pro-visional Government, and he alleged that there had been interference with the republican army by the Provisional Admipistration.

There are now five distinct armed forces in Ireland, O'Connor declared, but he claimed the body he represented was the army of the people. He said his views were shared by Eamon de alera.
