### POET'S DAUGHTER IN PLAY

Eva La Gallienne Has Leading Role in Frank Molnar Comedy, "Lilium"

Eva La Gallienne, daughter of the poet, Richard Le Gallienne, will be seen in her original role of "Julia" in "Lilium," when the Frank Molnar comedy opens at the Adelphi Theatre Monday night.

Miss La Gallienne was born in London in 1902. Her mother was Julie Norregard, the poet's second wife, and a journalist of Paris and London. When five years old, Eva went to France, where she received her early education. Her dramatic career was begun at Herbert Tree's London Academy of Dramatic Art, and she made her debut as "Julia" in "The Daughter of a Poet" at the Prince of Wales Theatre. In the same season she came to New York, playing a comedy part in "Bunny."
