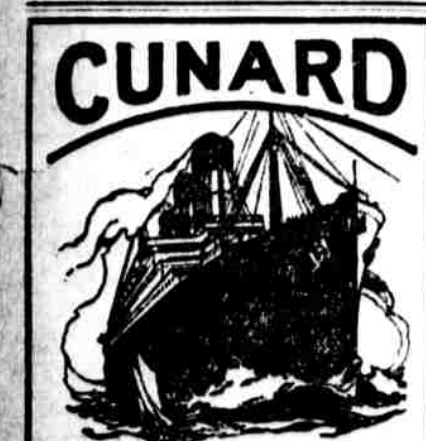

HOW ROOSEVELT BROKE 1902 STRIKE

Threat to Seize Mines With Army Made Operators Retreat From "No Compromise"

FACED EVENTS LIKE TODAY

Control of coal mines by the United States Army and the mining of coal by soldiers was the drastic action planned by Theodore Roosevelt, President at the time of the great strike in the summer of 1902.

The strike, which began in May, was ended in October of the same year, after what had appeared to be a deadlock between miners and operators was broken by the strategy of Roosevelt.

At that time the unwillingness of operators to recognize the United Mine Workers of America as the real representatives of the miners was a major factor in the development of the strike.

Agreement was a compromise. The miners' demands were for a 20 per cent increase in wages...

From Theodore Roosevelt's autobiography: "The big coal operators had banded together and positively refused to take any steps toward an accommodation."

Both Sides Together. "Finally on October 3 the representatives of both the operators and the miners met before me in pursuance of my request."

Right Commissioner Sought. Discussion here centered upon the appointment of a laboring man to the Arbitration Commission.

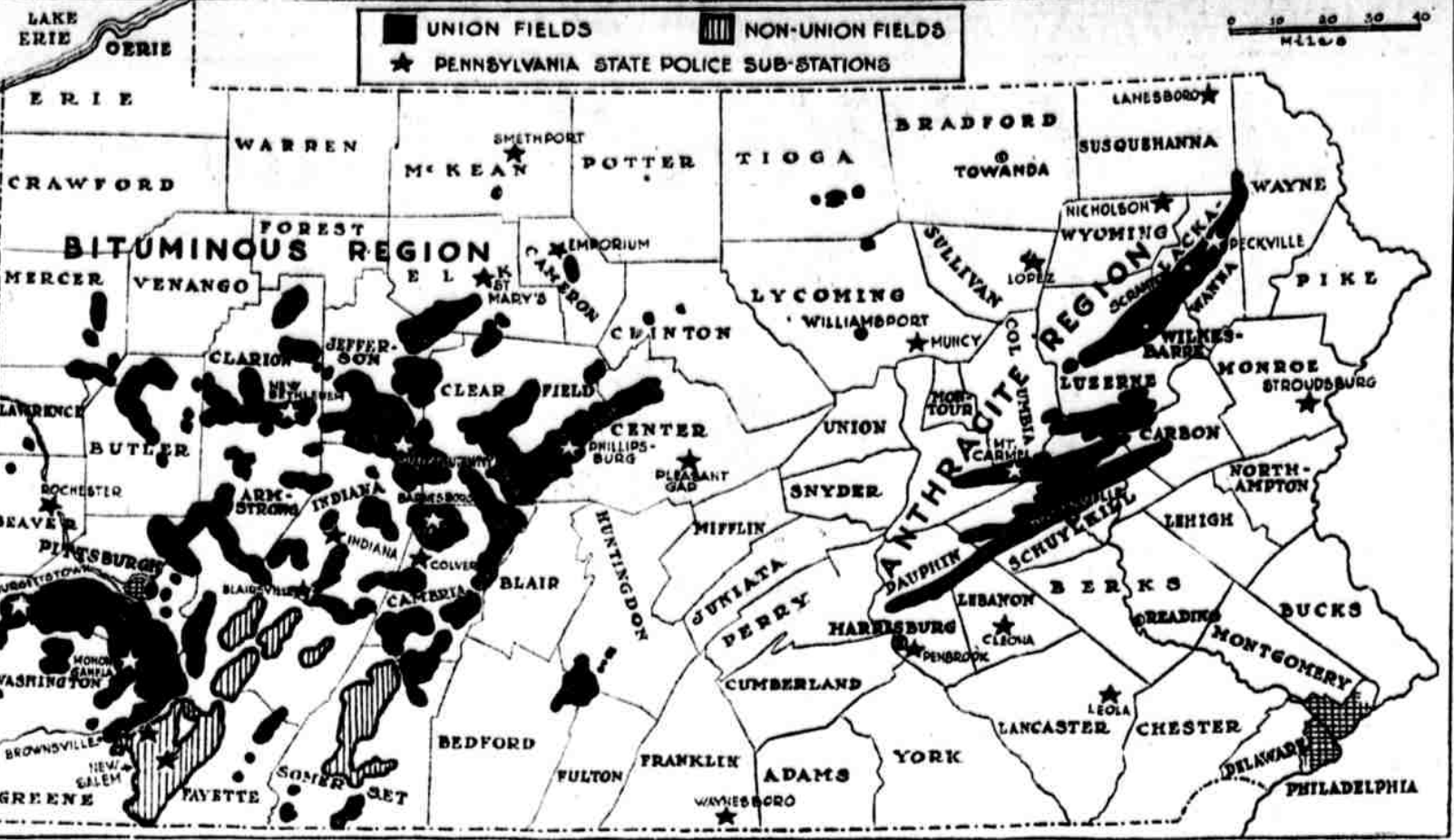
For Federal Intervention. "The method of action I had determined in the last resort was to get the Governor of Pennsylvania to ask me to send troops."

Was "Ready to Act". "I was ready to act, and would have done so without the slightest hesitation or a moment's delay if the negotiations had fallen through."

When October brought the first signs of cold weather and there seemed to be the other hand, the President himself took a hand in the situation.

Labor Offered All Facts. Mitchell immediately answered that he and his friends would be only too glad to submit the whole matter to arbitration by a tribunal to be named

By the President. The meeting then adjourned until 3 o'clock to give the operators an opportunity to consider and prepare their replies.

Quotations from Roosevelt's Autobiography, as well as from other writers, give evidence of the strategy of the strike, which threatened to make the homes of millions and to shut down industry throughout the country.

Failed to Reach Agreement. The operators turned a deaf ear to the proposition that the whole matter be submitted to a commission to be appointed by the President.

From Thayer's Roosevelt. "The President was justly indignant at the attitude of the operators."

Pottsville, Pa., April 1.—A complete shut-down of all the coal operations in this district opened the miners' strike today.

The Lehigh Coal and Navigation Company has 12,000 men, the Lehigh Valley Coal Company, 8,000 and the others are divided between independent operators.

The Board of City Trusts of Philadelphia will lose heavily in income by the strike, as all the lands of the Girard Estate are leased on the royalty plan.

Shipments of coal were very active this morning on all railroads and from the number of trains going down the line it is estimated that the present week's production of the mines would not be suspended.
