GOSSIP OF THE STREET

Little importance was attached to the upturn in call money, which carried the rate up to 5 1/2 per cent on Friday, as the calling of loans which resulted in this advance was the usual accumulation of funds in order to provide for end-of-the-month requirements and April 1 dividend and interest disbursements.

Month's Business Developments

The Franklin National Bank, in its monthly digest of trade conditions, says: "This month's analysis of the country's business situation finds advanced the betterments, as compared with a heavier stock and bond sales, a decrease in money in circulation, a lower living cost, heavier freight loadings, greater building activity, increased number production and shipments, heavier petroleum production and increased consumption of tin, silk and wool."

More New Bond Offerings

During the current week it is expected there will be a number of new bond offerings, including a large Czechoslovakian loan, a building loan and possibly one or two others, it being known that negotiations along these lines are proceeding satisfactorily, with the indications pointing toward such a movement being resumed with little effort after a brief setback, which disclosed not only a strong technical position, but also a notable absence of an unwelcome long interest, despite the long duration of the upward movement.

Investment Outlook Bright

Investment conditions at the moment present a brighter outlook than for a long time past. This is due to a number of influences which are not only factors at the moment, but which should prove more so in the future. The indications are that money market conditions will continue easy because as yet there has been no general revival in business, and it is regarded as improbable that any appreciable change for the better in this respect will take place before the middle of the year at the earliest.

One Step and Other Beginnings

Commenting on the big coal strike on Saturday, a downtown broker remarked: "Mining of coal in the union fields of Illinois, Indiana, Ohio and Pennsylvania was halted today by the strike. While this was happening, the copper miners, after more than a year's unemployment, resumed work in a small but general way. Thus one item offsets the other. No harm need be anticipated from the stoppage of operations in the coal fields. Mining has been overdone for some years and a sufficient check to the output will put the whole industry in better shape eventually."
