

# DEMAND OUSTING OF SCHOOL BOARD

Citizens' Committee in Gloucester Will Ask Resignation of Members

## SCRAP OVER PRINCIPAL

A demand will be made upon the Gloucester City School Board at its next meeting to resign because of recent troubles over Wilmer C. Burns, the supervising principal of the high school.

This was announced today by a Citizens' Committee, of which A. S. Pearce is chairman and J. B. Byrnes secretary. The committee met last night and decided upon this action.

In the event the members of the board refuse to get out, the committee decided to go into the courts and ask for a mandamus, to compel them to show cause why they should not resign.

The school board was appointed by Mayor David M. Anderson. A new member is appointed each year, to serve a five-year term. H. Meyer Black was named to the board last February. He was accepted by name in the resolution passed by the Citizens' Committee demanding the board members' resignation, on the ground that as a new appointee he had not had a fair chance to show what he could do.

The claim was made by members of the Citizens' Committee that the affairs of the school are controlled by three members of the board of five. Recently it was reported that these members contemplated resigning of their own volition, because of the chaotic state of school affairs in Gloucester City. The members reconsidered their purpose, however, and the Citizens' Committee took its action in consequence.

The members of the school board whose resignations will be demanded are William Bradley, president; Harry C. G. secretary; Dr. J. A. Beck and Charles Maier.

The trouble in Gloucester City's school affairs came to a crisis last October when the Citizens' Committee demanded the resignation of Mr. Burns, the supervising principal. He was vindicated at that time. The recent resignation of William Kacher, and instructor in the high school, which resulted in a strike of high school pupils, revived the trouble. The members of the Citizens' Committee think that Mr. Burns, the supervising principal, should resign, as well as the members of the board.

After-Dinner Tricks  
No. 143—Disappearing Card  
A playing card is wrapped in a handkerchief and pushed into a large tumbler. Upon lifting the cloth the card has disappeared. Any one may push the card into the glass.  
To do the trick, get a piece of transparent celluloid, such as is used in automobile curtains. Cut this to the size and shape of a playing card, and place it underneath a pack of cards. The cards are lifted, and put beneath the handkerchief. Then remove the pack, leaving only the celluloid card. Any one can feel the card through the cloth.  
After some one has pushed the card into the tumbler, hold the glass a short distance from the spectators and above the level of their eyes. When the handkerchief is removed the card will be invisible in the tumbler.
