FURTHER SLOWING DOWN OF MARKET

More New Highs Made Despite Narrowing of Price Movement

New York, April 21.—There was a further quieting down of speculative enthusiasm in today's stock market with accompanying narrowing of price movement.

Overnight developments put a more hopeful aspect on Genoa Conference situation. At the same time Washington advices that sales tax is about the only problem President Harding will approve and the admission that it will be hard to pass a sales tax either in the House or Senate took a great deal of the sting out of the Soldier Bonus Bill bugaboo.

Early gains were held, but trading shifted soon after the opening to the railroads, utilities, shipping and food specialties.

Commodity Markets

GRAIN MARKET Chicago, April 21.—Wheat advanced 3/8 to 5/8 at the outset and early in the day was strong on active buying prompted by unexpected strength in Liverpool, which prices at the close were 3/4 higher.

Ons advanced 1/2 to 3/4 with the other markets despite the better weather for seedling.

Provisions were quiet with small price changes, but the undertone was steady with grain, and on a steady opening in the long run where prices were unchanged to be higher.

COTTON MARKET New York, April 21.—In the face of a clear weather map, quotations on the cotton exchange opened 4 to 7 points higher, chiefly due to large sales of print cloths at Fall River, a firmer and more active local goods market, favorable cables and liberal local covering.

NEW YORK COFFEE MARKET New York, April 21.—Talk of another London loan to the Brazilian Government to apply against coffee led to a renewal of demand for coffee contracts here, and the opening was 2 1/2 to 3 points higher.

At midday the local market was firmer and prices had worked up 8 to 10 points net with May short covering sending that option to 10.42. There is a holiday in Brazil today and no special cable advices were received by the exchange.
