PAINTER KILLED BY FALL
Rigging Breaks, Throwing Him to Ground Ninety Feet Below
York, Pa., April 22.—Milton Michaels, forty-eight years old, a painting contractor, of Hanover, was killed yesterday by a fall of ninety feet from a high building under construction. The accident occurred when the rigging of a crane broke, throwing Michaels to the ground. He died a few minutes later suffering from a broken neck, fractured skull, a broken leg and a shattered jaw.

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EXPERIMENTED WITH GUNPOWDER

Boys Find Powder, Blast Injures Four
West Phila. Windows Shattered and Women Faint Following "Experiment"
They Found Can in Park
Four boys were injured, one seriously; women fainted, house windows were shattered and bedlam reigned in a West Philadelphia neighborhood last night when Lester Levick, fourteen years old, a pupil at West Philadelphia High School, conducted an experiment with a can of gunpowder in the back yard of his home, 5923 Pine street.
