Prevention, He Says at Convention

CO-OPERATIVE DRIVE

 Washington, May 4.—Results of the latest tuberculosis were cited as a leading illustration of "the importance of the co-operation of public and private agencies," in an address by Secretary Hughes at the opening session of the annual meeting of the National Tuberculosis Association. Through public organizations had led the way, he said, the outcome had been aided by the constant vigilance of private agencies.

"It is well for the community to know," continued Mr. Hughes, "with respect to this dreadful disease, which was formerly regarded as a visitation of Providence, we hold the means of prevention. Early and correct diagnosis—as to which there is much to be demanded of the medical profession—segregation, adequate treatment—these are the essential measures."

"If a plague suddenly visited us with its destructive effect of this disease the Nation would be aroused to self-protection. Similarly too long dulled apprehension. Fortunately, that apprehension has largely disappeared. It is only through your constant activity that our communities will be kept to their opportunity and duty."

Other speakers at today's session included Dr. James Alexander Miller, president of the association, who urged that medical students be trained to fight tuberculosis; Godias J. Drolet, who declared this disease killed almost twice as many men as women in New York City; and Dr. Charles J. Haddock, managing director of the association, who reported a decrease of one-half since 1904 in the death rate from tuberculosis.

WOMAN FIGHTS SHIP BILL
 Candidate for Governor of South Dakota Exhorts Congressmen

Washington, May 4.—(By A. P.)—Opposition to the Administration ship subsidy bill was expressed today at the joint congressional hearings by Miss Alice Lorraine Daly, Non-Partisan League candidate for Governor of South Dakota. The legislation, she declared, would prove a gold mine for the shipping interests, "while Congress has handed only gold bricks to the farmers."

Miss Daly directed criticism particularly against the section relating to sale of Shipping Board vessels.

"As a representative of the farmers," she said, "I feel it would show me favor if Congress would ask shipping companies to pay only 2 per cent interest on the balance of the purchase price when farmers pay at least
