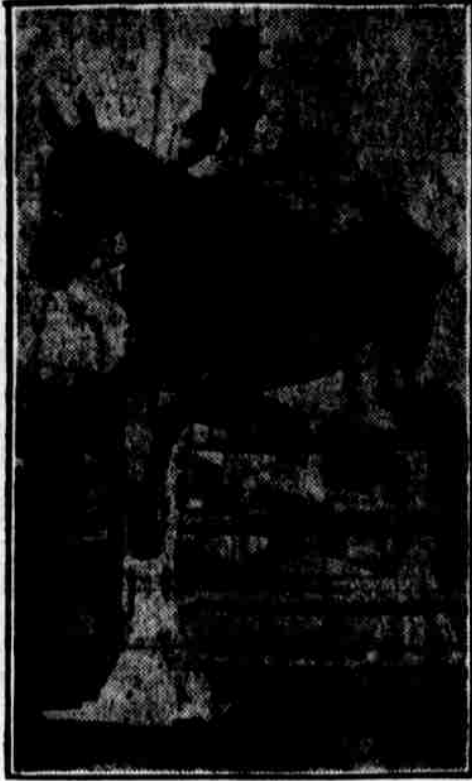
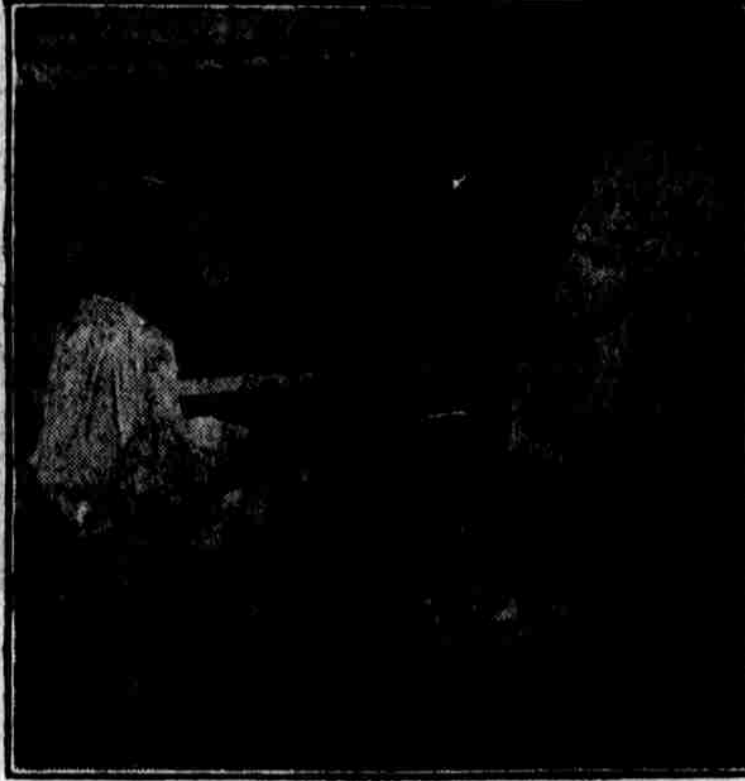


ONE OF THE RINGS. The camera snapped as the judges were picking the winners. Those who did not sit in the boxes watched the contests from the fence and benches.

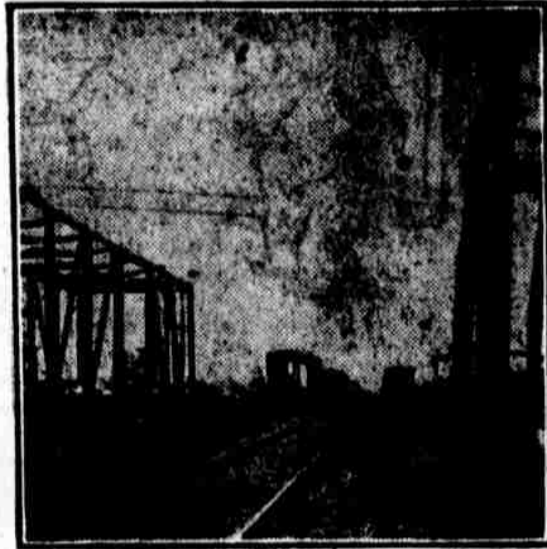

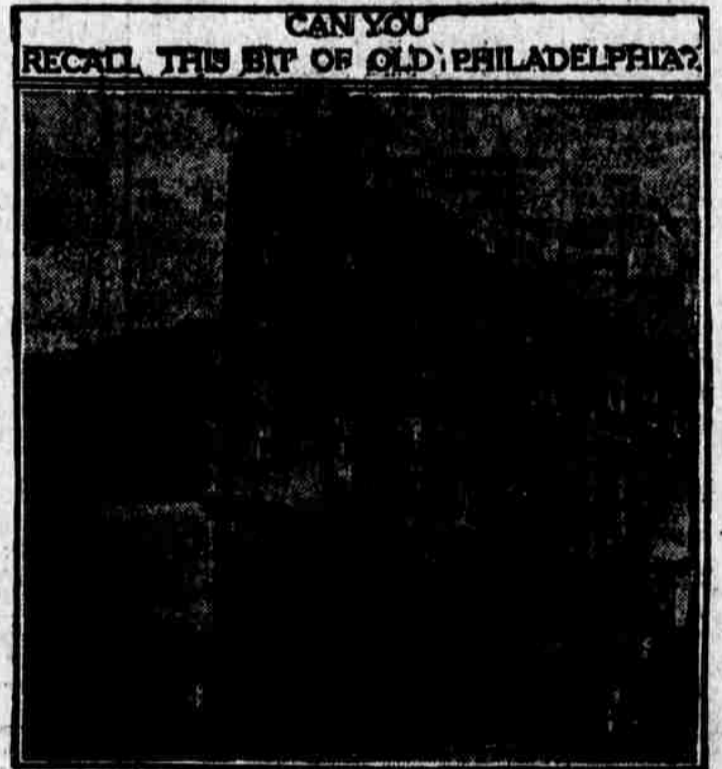

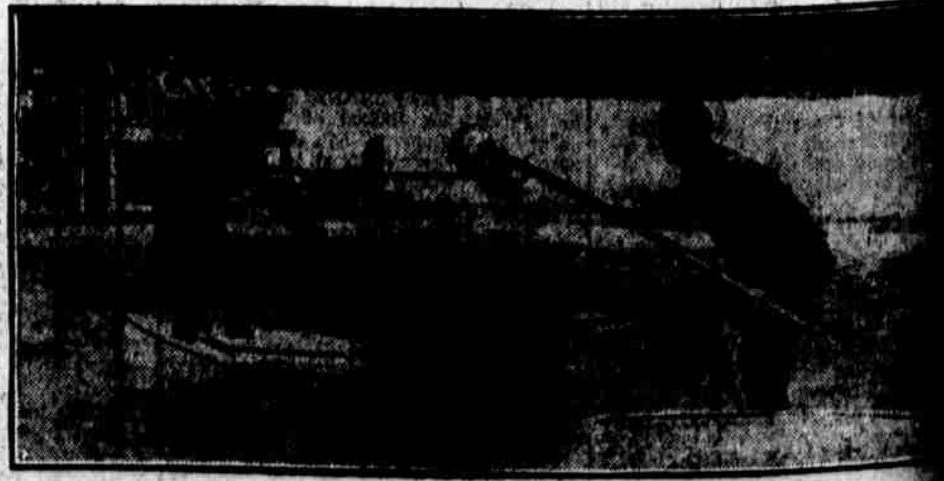
