

HOLDS OFF POLICE AFTER SHOOTING Camden Negro Gives Up When Home is Surrounded and Battle is Expected TAUNT CAUSED THE AFFRAY

Standing calmly at a second-story window of his home, Caleb Baynard, 40 Seymour street, Camden, charged with shooting Jeremiah Jordan, Sixth and Chestnut streets, deduced the score of the battle when they surrounded his policemen yesterday.

Baynard piled chairs and tables around the window and made every preparation for a fight. As about 100 persons had gathered about Baynard's home, the policeman decided to capture Baynard by strategy and avoid possible loss of life.

Patrolman William Piker, who Baynard told him he couldn't escape, and it would be useless to show fight. But Baynard was not so sure. He viewed the assembled crowd from the window. Finally he shouted: "If you don't get rough, I'll let you get me, but if you get ugly there'll be trouble."

Baynard, a Negro, went downstairs and submitted to arrest. There were several versions of the shooting, but the police are inclined to believe the story told by the prisoner.
