MAY INDUSTRIAL ACCIDENTS NUMBERED 9688

HARRISBURG, June 8.—May industrial accident reports of the Department of Labor and Industry show thirty fatalities in the mining industry as against thirty-eight in April. The effect of the strike were shown in the report in that there were only three fatalities in the anthracite region. Allegheny County had the most industrial fatalities during May with twenty-two, sixteen of them in plants. Philadelphia had eighteen, Cameron eight, Luzerne six and Westmoreland seven. All told, industrial accidents for the month numbered 9688.
